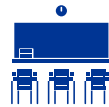

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Seattle Prep has an integrated humanities curriculum freshman through junior year. AP courses in the humanities are only offered in the senior year, with the exception of juniors who have a P.E. waiver for athletic team participation. AP courses in math and science are offered beginning in junior year to students in the advanced curriculum or to those who have schedule availability due to the P.E. waiver.



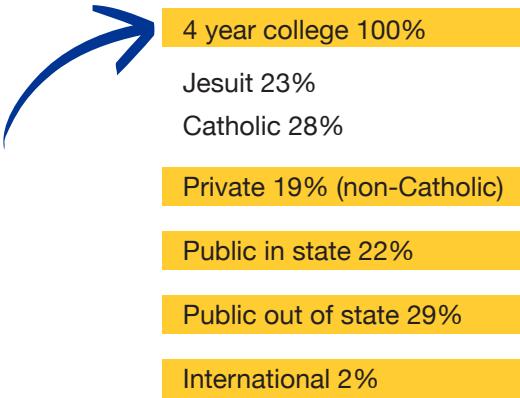

In May of 2025, a total of 404 students completed 1028 exams. In 11 of the 19 exams administered, the average scores were above the Washington State and global averages. In 13 of the 19 exams, average scores were above the global average.

Seattle Prep offers a rigorous college prep curriculum in the Jesuit tradition. View our curriculum [here](#). We are unique among the Jesuit high schools in that all students are enrolled in a common curriculum during their first three years of high school. The hallmark of this common curriculum is an interdisciplinary humanities course called Collegio, which incorporates English, history and theological themes. The class is team taught by history and English teachers and appears as two separate English and history courses on the student transcript. Honors courses are available only in math and science. We are committed to using technology to enhance our educational programs and have fully implemented a one-to-one technology program for the entire student body.
