What is A-G? Why Does It Matter?

The A-G requirements are a set of courses that high school students in California need to complete in order to be eligible for admission to the University of California (UC) System or California State University (CSU) system. These requirements are designed to ensure that students have a strong academic foundation in a variety of subject areas. The A-G requirements matter because they play a crucial role in determining a student's eligibility for CSU or UC admissions.

The A-G requirements consist of 15 specific college preparatory courses, which are divided into the following categories:

History/Social Science (2 years required)

NWEA Assessment Spring Testing Window is now open

Teachers are helping students take their Spring MAPs NWEA Math and English assessments. Families please encourage your students to do their very best when they take their MAPs NWEA assessments.

Students who meet their NWEA goal get 3% added to one of the courses. If they meet both math and reading goals they will get a 3% increase for two of their courses. Additionally, the NWEA test replaces an assignment on the day that they take each test.

State Testing SBAC/CAST

Grades 3-8 and 11th and 12th-grade students have taken or are completing their SBAC/CAST tests. Thank you for all your hard work getting students to take their tests.

English (4 years required)

Mathematics (3 years required, 4 years recommended)

Laboratory Science (2 years required, 3 years recommended)

Language Other Than English (2 years required, 3 years recommended)

Visual and Performing Arts (1 year required)

College Preparatory Electives (1 year required)

In order to be eligible for admission to the UC system, high school students must complete these A-G courses with a grade of "C" or better.
