Hello Roadrunner Families,

By now, you may have seen that our school remains at a 1 for the NSPF Star Ranking. I know many of you have asked how this is possible because you love the teachers and our school. We are disappointed as well, and though there is no short answer, factors like teacher vacancies in our testing grades in recent years have negatively impacted us. However, for three years we have been trending upwards, and this year we grew 8.5 index points (nearly to a two-star status), and that's how we know we are leveling up! This time next year, we are confident we'll be celebrating at least a two-star status!
