THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Graduation requires successful completion of 26 credits including: English (4 credits); Fine Arts (.5 credits); Math (4 credits); Science (3 credits); Social Studies (3.5 credits); Theology (4 credits); World Languages (2 credits). Some of our students graduate with more than 26 credits.

St. Joseph High School offers 16 different AP courses. Advanced Placement courses are offered including Art & Design, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, Environmental Science, European History, Psychology, Spanish Language and Culture, Statistics, US History, US Government and Politics. Additional AP courses are also offered through Virtual High School (including but not limited to: Computer Science, Economics, Art History, Macro and Micro-economics, Sign Language, and Statistics). These courses are available for students who wish to enroll in an AP or career applicable course that is not currently offered by an in-person instructor in the building.

St. Joseph High School offers 11 unique courses that allow students the opportunity to gain dual enrollment college course credit. Dual enrollment courses are offered in Biology, Entrepreneurship, Faith & Reason, International Relations, Physics, Statistics, US History, and World Religions through the University of Connecticut, Sacred Heart University, and the University of Iowa. Other courses include: Mandarin (Levels 1-4), Medical Microbiology, Principles of Engineering, Sports Medicine, Theatre, Robotics and Automation, Aeronautical Engineering, Broadcast Journalism, and Contemporary Political Philosophy.

Theology:

Each student is responsible for an annual course load of six or seven credits including Theology. Theology is as demanding as any other college preparatory course. We encourage colleges to include it when calculating a grade point average.

CO-CURRICULARS

Athletics:

St. Joseph High School fields 51 interscholastic teams that compete in the nationally recognized Fairfield County Interscholastic Athletic Association. In the last five years, our athletic facilities and professional coaching staff have produced a number of Division 1 athletes, as well as 25 team and individual State Championships. SJHS earned 10 state titles in the last five years alone.

A Health and Wellness Center serves the entire student body. We focus on nutrition exercise and developing healthy mental and physical life habits. Our varsity programs include: Baseball, Basketball, Bowling, Cheerleading, Cross Country, Field Hockey, Football, Golf, Gymnastics, Ice Hockey, Indoor Track, Lacrosse, Soccer, Softball, Swimming and Diving, Tennis, Track and Field, Volleyball, and Wrestling.

80% of our students are involved in one or more athletic team.



Clubs and Organizations:

We offer more than 40 different clubs and activities including Art, Asian Studies, Black Student Unity, Chess, Dance, Debate, Drama, Entrepreneurship, Game Development, E-Sports, Feelings First, Film Studies, French, Frisbee, Guitar, Interior Design, Irish, Italian, Jeopardy, Letters of Love, Math, Mock Trial, Model Congress, Multicultural, Philosophy, Pickleball, Ping Pong, Spanish, Stock Market, Women's Studies, Writing, Yearbook, and Youth Government.

Service:

St. Joseph High School students come to discover a true love of service. By the time they graduate, they view service not as a requirement but as a civic responsibility to their communities - locally and globally. Although we have modest service requirements (25 hours), students contribute to more than 36,000 hours of community service annually.
