Dutchtown High School staff is working hard to provide the most comprehensive and awarding education, experience, and opportunities to all students. Dutchtown is known for having a very diverse population of students, who are motivated and determined to become contributing and well-rounded members of society. Dutchtown has had students accepted at over 130 universities and colleges, and many of these schools being some of the most prestigious and superior post-secondary schools across the country. Dutchtown also have students who have been accepted into the military academies, such as the Air Force Academy and the Naval Academy.

While committing to providing students with the best education and opportunities possible, Dutchtown ensures this commitment by providing a phenomenal Advanced Placement (AP) program, gifted program, and opportunities and support for the Dual Enrollment (DE) program.

Dutchtown has been recognized as an AP Honor School for 2020, 2021, 2022, & 2023.

While focusing on academics, Dutchtown also provides students with extraordinary athletic and extra-curricular programs. Dutchtown believes that in order to ensure students are provided with opportunities to become well-rounded citizens, they must be provided with a well-rounded education. Dutchtown offers over 20 athletic programs for girls and boys, over 40 clubs on-campus for students to get involved and develop leadership skills, and an outstanding fine arts program. DHS also educates the whole child, providing students with a social and emotional learning (SEL) curriculum through our School Connect program. The multimedia curriculum is designed to improve high school students' social, emotional, and academic skills and strengthen relationships among students and between students and teachers.



Graduation Requirements

All students are expected to complete a common set of requirements and earn a minimum total of 23 units of credit for a regular diploma. Students entering 9th grade fall 2024 and after are required to earn 24 credits.

Awarding of Credits

High school courses are one semester, by block scheduling. Credits are awarded on a semester basis. Henry County offers online courses for new credit as well as recovery credit and a tuition-based summer school.

Rank and Grading Scale

Due to the level of difficulty, honors courses receive an additional .5 quality point added to the final grade and Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses receive an additional 1.0 quality point added to the final grade. All required and elective courses are utilized in the computation of the cumulative weighted and non-weighted numerical averages and the high school weighted and non-weighted grade point averages (GPA).
