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Good afternoon,

As we move toward the next phase of the Board of Directors election process, I am providing you with the official **distribution of votes** for the upcoming election, calculated in accordance with Section 6.03(d)–(e) of the Texas Property Tax Code. Please find your entity's allocation attached for reference.

**Nominations must be submitted before October 15, 2025.** Each taxing entity entitled to vote may nominate **one candidate for each open place** (Places 4 and 7) by **written resolution**. To be considered valid, the resolution must be adopted and received in my office no later than the close of business on October 14, 2025. \*6.03(g)

Please ensure that each nomination includes the full name and contact information of the nominee. **Once nominations are received, our office will prepare and distribute the official ballot by October 30.**

As a reminder, individuals nominated must:

- Reside in Denton County and have done so for at least two years prior to taking office;
- Not be employed by a taxing entity served by DCAD (unless serving as an elected official); and
- Meet all other eligibility requirements under Section 6.03 of the Texas Property Tax Code.
