Hello Families.

Thank you to those of you who were able to attend our Open House! If you attended, I hope you gained more insight into how we can partner to help your child(ren) achieve success. If not, please feel free to reach out to your teacher to clarify because our strong partnership makes a huge difference!

By now, all of the students have taken the Fall MAP assessment. We use the data from MAP to help guide us in meeting your child's academic needs. The students will take the MAP again in the winter and then again in the spring, and each time our goal is to help them meet their growth goals and become proficient, or maintain proficiency. Ensuring they attend school every day so they can receive our instruction, making sure they complete their Monthly Homework Menu, and ensuring they read daily by signing a slice on their Apple Core bookmark are three huge ways families can support their children. Another piece we are working hard on this year is to help students take responsibility for their learning and their actions. One thing you can do at home to support this is, whenever your child encounters a problem, seek to understand and guide them rather than solving the problem for them. This will help with everything from managing their schoolwork to their relationships.

As an additional support to our families, I'll be leading a workshop with Ms. Nicholson on how to help your 3rd -5th grade child regulate their emotions when problems occur, and the PreK team will be presenting the same topic to PreK-2nd grade families on Sept 19th. We'll be sending Tucker Tortoise kits home to those who attend. I hope to see you all there, as this is something all of our students need support with to be successful in elementary school and beyond.
