



SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Honors Courses | UMAHS offers 20 Honors courses, including advanced choir and band.

Virtual High School (VHS) | Provides students with online courses not offered at UMAHS. A maximum of 40 students/semester are selected to enroll in VHS courses based on GPA and ability to independently monitor progress.

Dual Enrollment | Upper Merion partners with Montgomery County Community College and Harrisburg University of Science & Technology to offer Dual Enrollment opportunities. Students may earn college credit in advance, with eligibility for up to 14 courses through MCCC and 7 courses through Harrisburg University. All Dual Enrollment courses are taught at either the AP or Honors level, representing our most rigorous academic offerings.

Central Montco Technical High School (CMTHS) | PCMTHS offers programs that prepare students for both the workforce and higher education, while fostering civic responsibility, employability skills, leadership, and professionalism. All programs are competency-based and tailored to each student's needs and interests.


In 2025, 233 students participated in 428 AP Exams. 85% of students earned a score of 3 or better. Students are not required to test for the AP Exam.

UMAHS reports weighted & unweighted GPAs on each student's transcript. Unweighted GPA is based upon numerical values of A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0 for all levels of instruction. A weighted GPA is also calculated by adding bonus points to a student's unweighted GPA for Honors or AP courses. Each Honors or AP course in which a student has received a C or better will award .2 bonus points per credit.
