Important High School Terms

Credit

- A unit showing a student has successfully completed a course
- Each passing semester of a course earns 0.5 credits

GPA

- Grade Point Average
- Cumulative
- Higher GPAs may equate to more college and scholarship opportunities

Class Rank

■ The measure of a student's performance in comparison to other students in the class (grade level) first given at the beginning of 10th grade

Transcript

- Permanent academic record starts with high school course work
 - High School credits earned in middle school will be on transcript but not all will be added to GPA
- Credit Responsibility
 - Shared by parents, student, counselor
 - See counselor if classes are missing or have already earned the credit
- Utilized by colleges, employers, and military
- What's on the transcript?
 - Semester grades
 - GPA
 - Class Rank
 - Standardized test scores STAAR EOC
