





AP Scholars with Distinction

The Advanced Placement (AP) Scholar Awards are granted each fall by the College Board's AP Program to recognize high school students who demonstrate outstanding college-level achievement through their performance on multiple AP Exams.

At West Chicago Community High School, 138 students earned AP Scholar recognition this year. The highest honor within this program is the AP Scholar with Distinction Award. To achieve this award, students must earn an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken and a score of 3 or higher on five or more exams.

This year, 52 students earned the AP Scholar with Distinction Award. Of these, 24 were graduates of the Class of 2025. We proudly recognize the remaining 28 students from the current Senior class at WCCHS, who will also receive cords to wear at graduation. Each of these students has shown exceptional dedication and academic excellence. We congratulate them on this remarkable achievement.

CREATIVE WRITING


Unlocking Creativity, One Free Write at a Time


In Tara Deleon's creative writing class, the journey from a flickering thought to a finished work of art is a testament to the power of imagination. Far from the typical writing assignment, Deleon's students are not just telling stories with words, but with a vibrant array of artistic mediums.

The process begins each week with three 8-minute free writes, a chance for students to put their raw ideas on the page. From these quick drafts, students select a single piece to become their "Free Write Expansion" project." I give students three choices for expansion: written, visual, and video, "Deleon explains, "and the original free write must be a part of the finalized piece."

This approach encourages students to think beyond the page, pushing them to explore how their narrative can take on a new life. As Deleon points out, the "process itself is where the true magic takes place," and the results are a vivid showcase of student ingenuity. Past projects have included welded statues, narrated videos, comic strips, screenplays, and charcoal sketches, each one starting from a simple idea and transforming into something truly special.








The projects offer a unique window into the personal experiences and perspectives of the students themselves. For Rodrigo Hernandez Rubio, the expansion project became a spiritual expression. "The poem and welded art piece was a powerful, religious creation that allowed me to express my faith," he shares.

Other students used the opportunity to explore their imaginations and find new ways to tell a story. As Jason Merino notes, "Creative Writing class allows me to bring what's in my imagination to reality. I can give inanimate objects like my favorite belt a life of their own by personifying them!"

By giving them the space to explore both their inner thoughts and their artistic talents, Tara Deleon's creative writing class is helping students see their own potential in entirely new ways. The finished products are a beautiful glimpse into their minds, showing how a small spark of an idea can grow into a meaningful work of art.

GEOMETRY IN CONSTRUCTION

Real-World Skills, Real-World Impact


The hammers are swinging and saws are humming as the Geometry in Construction program kicks off its second year at WCCHS with an impressive start! Students are getting their hands dirty on practical, real-world projects that not only teach valuable skills but also directly benefit our school community.

This year, the program is helping the AVID department bring a special vision to life. AVID seniors from the Class of 23-24 painted rocks to represent their individual post-secondary pathways, while juniors created Wego-themed rocks to begin filling a planned AVID Rock Garden. When the location for the garden was reassigned to another project, the AVID program needed a creative new solution to display these meaningful rocks and continue the tradition of adding to the collection each year.

That's where the Geometry in Construction classes stepped in. Under the guidance of Mr. Kleffner and Mrs. Lindgren, students are constructing large, letter-shaped display cases that spell out "AVID." These letters will provide an impactful way to showcase the rocks and promote the program at key events like 8th-grade open house, parent nights, and the Senior Signing Awards Ceremony. The displays will also serve as a daily reminder of the AVID program's mission to the entire student body.







Meanwhile, Mr. Johnson and Mrs. Lindgren's students are continuing to make an impact by crafting detailed bird, bee, and butterfly houses and hotels. These structures will soon be installed in Club Green's prairie area with Mrs. Burchaki, providing a welcoming environment for local wildlife and enriching our school's outdoor spaces.

These projects highlight the program's unique blend of math, construction skills, and community impact; giving students practical experience while giving back to the Wildcat community, proving that geometry isn't just on the page—it's in the world all around us.


