Ronald E. McNair Middle School's students, parents, and staff work continuously to improve student achievement in the following ways:

As School Administrator, Staff and teachers, we will:

- Deliver high-quality instruction that builds a complete understanding of multiplication and division of fractions through modeling, hands-on activities, and real-world problem solving.
- Teach reading strategies that help students cite multiple sections of the text to support their thinking in discussions and written responses.
- Provide parents/ students with interventions support using Reading Plus, I-Ready, ELA, I-Ready Math to help with academic achievement.
- Host parent workshops focused on math and reading strategies.

As Parents and Guardians, we will:

- Encourage your child to practice multiplication and division of fractions at home using school-provided tools and resources.
- Support your child in reading by discussing texts and helping them cite multiple sections to explain their understanding.
- Use ELA/ Math standard-based interventions, such as I-Ready, provided by the teacher with my child at home for at least 15-20 minutes to support mastery of ELA/Math skills.
- Attend school events, workshops, and conferences.

As Students, we will:

- Actively participate in classroom activities that help build a complete understanding of multiplication and division of fractions.
- Practice reading strategies that allow you to cite multiple sections of the text when answering questions or writing responses.
- Use I- Ready Reading and I-Ready Math to assist with ELA/Math assignments at home for 15-20 minutes daily.
- Attend and use pamphlets and materials given to my parents from the parent events, workshops, and conferences to assist with ELA/ Math questions that might require understanding of fraction operations and text-based evidence strategies.
