Our promise is to deliver an excellent Christ-centered education which prepares students to be leaders who impact the world for Christ.

New Program Introduction: The Impact Project!

In the 2024–2025 school year, CSAGH schools introduced a new opportunity for juniors and seniors to explore an IMPACT Project, an individualized experience in the areas of Interest, Mission, Partnership, Authority (Leadership), Career, or Trade. This initiative allows students to live out the qualities of a CSAGH graduate in meaningful and expanded ways.

Instead of participating in a traditional J-Term course at HCS or WSCA, 11th and 12th graders are now discovering unique opportunities to meet their IMPACT requirements. These projects extend over months rather than weeks, giving students the chance to pursue something they are passionate about and make a lasting difference in the world. Each project is designed to be personal and purposeful, requiring a minimum of 25 off-campus hours, an Experience Log, and a final End-of-Project Reflection.

Through these experiences, students reflected the call of Scripture in Micah 6:8 and Philippians 2:5–11 while embodying the vision of the CSAGH Profile of a Graduate. All HCS and WSCA juniors and seniors completed an IMPACT project in the 2024–2025 school year. Check out five examples on the next page!








Our Growing Community

Students by Grade Level 2024-2025




Pre-K Partners






Summer Professional Development

While students were on summer break, CSAGH teachers and administrators invested their time in professional development, preparing to return to the 2025–2026 school year with new skills and insights. Professional development is a key part of the 2023–2026 CSAGH Strategic Plan, particularly through the "Develop Our Faculty and Staff" goal, which emphasizes three priorities: retaining teachers to enhance the classroom experience, growing potential leaders, and supporting ongoing teacher development.

Over the summer, faculty and staff attended conferences and trainings such as the CESA New Principals Institute, NAIS Institute for New Heads, Making the Leap Teacher Symposium, and the Herzog Foundation Institute. Teachers also pursued professional growth through Act 48 credits, ACSI Teacher Certification, ACSI Christian Philosophy of Education Certification, Capital Area Intermediate Unit Continuing Education Training, and more.

2023-2026 Enhance and Expand CSAGH Strategic Plan

I can't believe that the second year of our three-year plan is already complete. The plan is a catalyst that takes our schools forward, moving beyond strengthening to innovation. Why this focus? To provide an excellent Christ-centered education, we need to expand our programming to include more hands-on, collaborative, and technology-based programming. This will best fulfill our promise to prepare students to be leaders who impact the world for Christ.

As a reminder, the 2023–2026 Enhance and Expand Strategic Plan has four strategic areas of focus.

Innovation

We are working to innovate our curriculum, adding more technology and hands-on experiences, which infuse 21st-century skills that colleges and employers are looking for in our graduates. The outcome of this effort will be a maker space at all campus locations, a K–12th technology curriculum, and one device for every 6th–12th-grade student (1:1).

Connection

Students who are involved and connected are more likely to excel and benefit from our academic program. Connection is also a focus of our spiritual life program as we point students to Jesus and give them the opportunity to increase their connection to their faith.

Enhance and Expand

As our schools grow and we enroll more students and families attracted to our Christian mission, we are expanding facilities through the 2023–2026 Enhance and Expand Capital Campaign. The campaign goal is \$9.625 million. We are progressing well toward this goal with more than \$6.4 million in pledges and donations received so far.

Develop Our Faculty and Staff


Innovation requires teacher training in new skills. We are offering more professional development, advancement opportunities, and leadership options for our teachers. We are also increasing support for all employees so that we can retain our incredibly effective teachers and administrative teams.








Total Operational Giving for 2024–2025




Total giving was up 73% toward the annual operational budget.




2024-2025 Revenue

Turn Your PA Income Tax Dollars into Student Scholarships

Through Educational Improvement Tax Credits

How it works:

You will make an upfront donation of \$1,000 or more, up to the amount of your annual state taxes. When you file your taxes in the spring, you will receive a 90% refund of your donation from Pennsylvania and a federal tax deduction.

Donations are made through a Special Purpose Entity, a class of charity that exists solely to obtain PA Education Improvement Credits (EITC/OSTC). There are a limited number of credits available, so be sure to apply early.

How the money is used:

100% of your donations provide financial aid to Harrisburg Christian School or West Shore Christian Academy students who qualify for assistance based on their family's income.

Who qualifies?

LLC, Partnership, S-Corp, or Individuals with a PA tax liability of \$1,000 or more.

2024–2025 was a historic year for EITC and one to celebrate. EITC enables us to advance our schools and remain affordable to families who need financial aid, while we increase teacher pay and expand opportunities for our students.

We exceeded last year's EITC by \$800,000, an increase of more than 60%. For this, we are thankful to the Lord for his provision and for each person who participates!

CSAGH partnered with RedefinED to support the recruitment of more first-time EITC participants.

There are still many individuals and businesses who could participate, and we need to continuously improve our ability to expand this program within our community.



In 2024, CSAGH launched its Business Partner Program, welcoming 25 businesses.
