

UNAPPROVED MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE KADOKA AREA SCHOOL BOARD OF EDUCATION HELD TUESDAY SEPTEMBER 9TH, 2025, BUSINESS MEETING AT 7 PM.

The meeting was called to order by Board President Ross Block.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Board President Ross Block.

The Consent Agenda included the following items: to approve the agenda, to approve the minutes of the August 11th, 2025, meeting; to approve the financial report; to approve the bills as presented. Paul Roghair moved to approve the consent agenda. Motion was seconded by Mark Williams and carried.

CITIZEN'S INPUT: Mayor Weller and Josh Nelson addressed the board concerning student pedestrian safety. Christy Willert addressed the board concerning screening for dyslexia at an early age.

BOARD REPORTS: Buildings and Grounds met at the sports complex and discussed different options for the bathroom/concessions project. Another meeting will be held before the next board meeting. Board President Ross Block thanked Dawn Rasmussen and Rebecka Roghair for their years of service to the Kadoka Area School Board. Joseph Effling reported on the future of the Three Rivers Special Services Coop.

ADMINISTRATORS REPORTS: Mr. Hermann gave the current student numbers, which are similar to last year, and final count day will be at the end of the month. He reported school is in full swing he has kept busy with paperwork and bus driver training has been completed for this five-year cycle.

Mr. Shuck reported that interventions are in place for students that need them to help them succeed, and preliminary MAPS testing is underway.

Mr. Nemecek reported on the back-to-school nights and their attendance. He is looking into data to try to improve scores and help kids improve in the classroom.

Eric Wilmarth moved to accept the bid from Discount Fuel for bus diesel fuel for the Wanblee and Kadoka buses, motion was seconded by Mark Williams and carried.

Paul Roghair moved to accept the bid from Discount Fuel for gasoline for the Kadoka vehicles, motion was seconded by Mark Williams and carried.

Paul Roghair moved to approve the trust and custodial accounts, motion was seconded by Joseph Effling and carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: Mark Williams moved to go into executive session at 8:37 PM per SDCL 1-25-2(1) for personnel matters, motion was seconded by Paul Roghair and carried. The board came out of executive session at 9:12 PM.

CONTRACT: Joseph Effling moved to approve the independent contractor contract for special education needs with Pamela Bonenberger in the amount of \$75 per hour, motion was seconded by Paul Roghair and carried.

RESIGNATION: Eric Wilmarth to accept the resignation of Royal Addison as the middle school girl's basketball coach and advertise for the open position, motion was seconded by Paul Roghair and carried.

The October board meeting will be on Monday October 9th at 7:30 PM at the Kadoka School.

Mark Williams moved to adjourn, motion was seconded by Paul Roghair and carried.
