What is a School-Family Compact?

The School-Family Compact is an agreement that parents/families, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how parents/families and teachers work together to ensure all students reach and exceed the State's high academic standards.

Jointly Developed

The parents, students, and staff worked collaboratively to develop the School-Family Compact. Using the school survey, parents, students, staff, and community members provided feedback on strategies for family engagement and student success. During PLCs, teachers meet to develop strategies for parents to use at home. Meetings are held yearly to review and revise the compact based on the school's academic achievement goals and students' needs.
