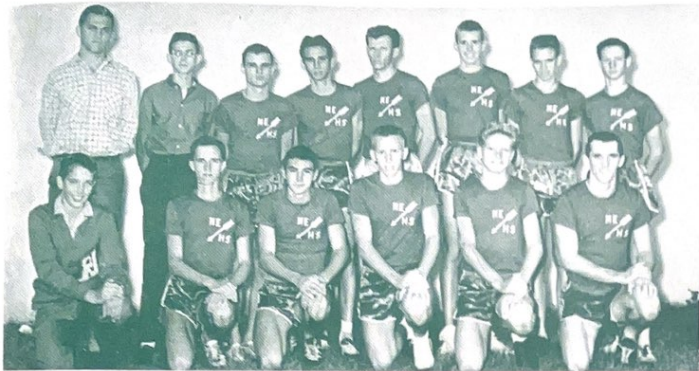

## VIKING HARRIERS SECOND IN STATE

Orlando Boone won the Class AA Florida High School cross-country title yesterday but the second-place finish of St. Petersburg's Northeast High is what set tongues wagging.

Low total wins in cross country. Each finisher is charged with the same number of points as his order of finish. For example, Fort Lauderdale's Bob Redington won the individual championship in the record time of 10 minutes, 13.3 seconds and charged his team with only one point. Second place finisher is charged two points, the third, three, etc.

Wayne Goodner, 10:50, was 11th; Harry Sinclair, 10:52, was 13th; Steve Bond, 11:01, was 18th and Carl Miller, 11:31, was 39th. Bob Leigh and Wade Harrington also represented Northeast in the meet but only the first five finishers on each team cost points.

Coach Pete Gray said he was extremely proud of his "kids." He said each one of them clipped at least 20 seconds from the previous clockings.

The cross country course is two miles long over wooded and hilly terrain.

### Poynter Scholarships Designed For Beginners

The Scholarship-Fellowship Program of the Poynter Fund is designed to develop better qualified beginners for staff positions with newspapers and other mass communications, and for securing the dedication of outstanding people to newspaper work and thereby improving the staff standing of the industry.

Poynter Fund scholarships are to be awarded according to merit, qualifications, dedication, and demonstration of aptitude for publishing and broadcasting. Financial need is not to be considered a qualification for a Poynter Fund Scholarship.

For the purpose of granting these scholarships the newspaper career field is broken down into four categories which must be considered flexible. They are: newswriting, editing, broadcasting, and administration. Second, business and administration; third is creative; and fourth is technological.

Awards made to high school students would be held in escrow until they were enrolled in an accredited college in a curriculum which would lead to a career in the field of newspaper work but not necessarily a curriculum in journalism itself.

Eligible for Poynter Fund Scholarships are young men and women who have dedicated themselves to careers in newspaper work and broadcasting.

Candidates for scholarship awards must prove outstanding potential for successful newspaper careers through testing, interviewing, and where possible, by actual performance.

Applications for scholarships must be supported by at least three letters of recommendation, two of which should come from high school teachers or college professors who have taught the applicant in areas which lead to a newspaper or broadcasting career. All awards will be made on a competitive basis. In addition to the scholarships, the Poynter Fund may award one graduate fellowship of

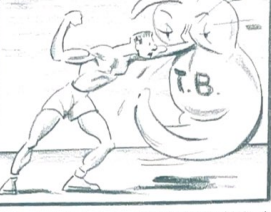

## Top Physical Condition Best Weapon For T.B.

### KNOCK T.B. OUT WITH GOOD HEALTH

When tuberculosis swept entire countries under the aegis of the white plague, it obtained a major reputation that has remained through the ages. From generation to generation, decisions have passed concerning tuberculosis.

The word tuberculosis produces a sense of dread and fear in the hearts of people who have known it as a menacing killer. The role T.B. takes on by predominantly, in civilized areas, there has been a progressive reduction in the mortality rate from tuberculosis mainly because of the better economic and social conditions and the present campaigns against tuberculosis.

Tuberculosis is a chronic infectious disease caused by an invasion of the body of the bacillus tuberculosis. The tubercle bacillus is a rod-shaped organism which enters the body, a reaction is set up. The stimulation of inflammatory cells produces a tiny nodule or tubercle. The lesion may be several inches in diameter by the time an x-ray is taken.

Sitting helplessly at his desk, Richard Northway stared at the scores of homework papers piled before him. He wrote rapidly at the typewriter, his work before him. His final question was answered and the last chapter read. Richard flipped his book, ex-cessively tired.

Tired and feeling ill, he will push himself through endless days before he realizes there is something wrong.

Richard Northway, at seventeen, is about to become a casualty of tuberculosis simply because he has neglected to keep himself in the best of health.

**HEALTHY BODY**

The healthy body will beat TB seven better than the body that is riddled. Unsanitary conditions, constant exposure to dust, debility from overwork, and mental and physical strains are factors which increase susceptibility to tuberculosis.

The most tragic aspect of tuberculosis is that it may exist without the victim's knowledge. It may occur without symptoms or very often the symptoms do not appear until the disease has progressed to the more advanced stages.

There is no definite pattern for choosing a victim. It affects the young and old, the rich and poor alike. It could happen to you.

This incident occurred through an unfortunate accident. At the time of the accident, although tuberculosis has been a striking characteristic of the teenage individual of today.

**CLASSIC SYMPTOMS**

The classic symptoms of tuberculosis are weight loss, easy fatigability and a slight cough.

What revolves in the mind of a person who is suspected of having tuberculosis? He convinces himself by reading that he is a world of doctors, nurses, and strange hospital surroundings.

The myth that the Danes eat too much arises partly from the fact that they do eat too much and partly because visitors from abroad are a welcome excuse for bringing out the very best they have. That is, what they consider the very best. This is what a Danish menu looks like when there are visitors about. When there are no visitors, it must be austere, but the authorities are Danes, of course, so they are partial to visitors. We begin the day with a Danish breakfast, mostly a cup of coffee or tea, four or five different kinds of bread, marmalade, Danish cheese, bacon and eggs—or if you are on a diet a boiled egg and, of course, Danish pastry. Remember you can only get Danish bacon in England.

Lunch at home or away consists of Smorrebrod. This is a national dish in several hundred varieties. It is concocted on a foundation of "Franskbrød" (white bread) or "Stigebrød" (light rye bread) or "rugbrød" (dark rye bread) which is most health-giving and good for you. It is met with suspicion until you have tasted it. For lunch we drink beer, milk, coffee, or tea depending on how old you are and what day it is.

In late afternoon many have a little meal called "eftermiddagskaffe" which consists of coffee and cakes.

People have dinner—consisting of almost anything—about six or seven o'clock in the evening. We call it "Middag"—midday—but this is not as unreasonable as it sounds. The main dish is meat, which means steak, veal cutlet, pork chop, or chicken. Fish is both plentiful and excellent in Denmark, and very few households look upon it as food in the proper sense of the word. There are Danish specialties such as lobster and oysters for the rich; there are mussels and tripe for the eccentric. If he or she can help it; but everybody or nearly everybody eats game and venison with enthusiasm in the winter season. Vegetables are good, of course, but many Danes look upon them as intended for cows, sheep, and rabbits.

Danish specialties are "køgt Torsk" (boiled cod), "engelsk Bøf" (English steak in a form unknown to the English), "gule Aelter" (a soup made of dried peas and served with pork, sausages, or sometimes pickled goose), "stegt Aal" (fried eel which foreigners too often assume to be fried snake), "Flæskesteg med Rødkål" (roast pork and red cabbage) and "Frikadeller" (rissoles). We have occasional unfortunate lapses such as "Sjdsuppe," (which is a sweet soup of fruit juice), "Olebrød" beer soup, which is made of rye bread with beer in it, and different kinds of porridges of which we are rather proud. The porridge is served as a first course at home.

It should be stressed once again that private entertaining always presupposes a creaking table. Only half the food is ever eaten, after which the family proceeds to live on the left-overs for the next few days. Remember, however, that guests are always expected to eat up what they have taken on their plates. You can safely partake sparingly of the first dish served. It will be handed round once or twice again—except in Jutland. There is is usual to hand it round five times and the visitor is considered either to be ill or not like the food if he does not help himself at least four times.
