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OVERVIEW

We're determined to be a community that changes the world for the better. It's about what you can do rather than what you can't; where every student, at any level of ability, from any culture, is happy and excited because they can choose how they want to learn, not just what they want to learn. ASW is a college-preparatory, Pre-K through Grade 12, independent, not-for-profit international community school.

ASW is located on a pre-K to Grade 12 10-hectare campus just south of the Warsaw city limits. There are 101 classrooms, 7 science labs, a Design and Technology Center, 5 music rooms, 5 art rooms, a library, 3 gymnasiums, a full-service cafeteria, a professional theater, and a swimming pool. There are also multiple playgrounds, a fully lighted track, soccer fields, 2 softball fields, outdoor tennis courts, and a multipurpose sports court. ASW has recently completed a major renovation, including a new design center, new science labs and upgraded classrooms.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

ASW offers an American High School Diploma that is further enriched by the International Baccalaureate Diploma, and most graduates earn dual diplomas. The Upper School is a one-to-one laptop learning environment, and students study on an 8-day cycle. The school calendar runs from mid-August to mid-June. Grades 9 and 10 have 9 rotating blocks with 4 or 5 blocks per day at 80 minutes each. Grade 9 students enroll in 9 classes while Grade 10 students enroll in a minimum of 8 classes. Grades 11 and 12 have 8 rotating blocks with 4 blocks per day at 90 and 75 minutes each for HL and SL respectively. Students must enroll in a minimum of 6 classes. In addition to the offerings listed below, ASW has partnered with Pamoja and Global Online Academy (GOA) to allow students access to a wider range of course options. ASW does not rank students nor calculate GPA. In addition to the course offerings below, students with documented learning challenges/diagnoses are able to take non-IBDP courses, which are embedded into the IBDP courses, but IB-specific requirements have been removed from assessment criteria.

Standardized Testing for University Applications

ASW is an SAT test center. Because of the diverse landscape of standardized testing requirements, students work with counselors to determine if standardized testing is necessary or beneficial for their university application. Representative SAT and ACT data is not available due to the low number of current Grade 12 students who have taken the SAT and/or ACT.

EXTRACURRICULAR OFFERINGS

ASW students are able to participate in a wide variety of athletic, cultural, and service-oriented activities. ASW is a full member of regional sport and cultural associations including the Central Eastern European Schools Association (CEESA) as well as the Sports Council of International Schools (SCIS). The three seasons of sports include varsity and junior varsity soccer, volleyball, basketball, swimming, softball, tennis, track & field, and cross country. Students may also participate in many other activities, including jazz band, speech & debate, outdoor clubs, environmental clubs, Model United Nations, math team, student government, and community service.
