1. Strategic Focus for 2025-2026 School Year

- <u>Strategic Focus</u> / <u>Minutes from Strategic Planning Meeting</u> Mr. Bohm introduced the strategic focus areas for 2025-2026, which are noted in the following pillars.
- Action Plan Tracking Document is the document the Committee uses to track progress toward goals.

2. Pillar I: Reduce environmental impact and costs

- Referendum Update Mr. Bohm gave an up date on Referendum projects and invited Committee members to attend upcoming Referendum information sessions.

- Summer 2025 Capital Projects Update
 - Water Bottle Fillers, IT Access Points for Outdoors, Gaga Pits, Water Heaters, Asbestos Flooring Removal and more! Mr. Bohm gave an update on projects done this summer.

3. Pillar II: Improve the health and wellness of schools, students, and staff

- Outdoor Spaces Update
 - \$39,463 Trees for Schools Grant @ RMS Mr. Bohm updated the Committee on the Trees for Schools Grant from NJ DEP and Sustainable Jersey. Volunteers Cameron McKenzie and Neil Hendrickson are working with Betsy Freeman to execute this grant. The grant addresses all Sustainability pillars and is a great partnership between many local entities. Tree planting will happen in the Spring. Several ideas were suggested to establish a connection between students and the plantings, such as naming the trees

and/or putting a strand of students' hair in the planting hole to give students a sense of stewardship.

\$22,500 Wellness Grant for staff

Mr. Bohm updated the Committee on a grant the district received from our Health Insurance Provider which will offer Professional Development and wellness opportunities on October and March inservice days for staff, with topics like cooking and healthy eating.

Mr. Bohm thanked all staff members who worked on the application. The Board will celebrate this success at the Oct meeting. Mr. Becker, from Readington Township's Environmental Commission, congratulated the schools and updated the Committee on the Township's application. They will find out in the coming weeks which level they received. He added that the Township has 20 acres of a tree planting project that they are always looking for students to participate in, please reach out to him if interested.

5. Unfinished / New Business

- Green Coordinator Stipend / Funds and Recommendation of Finance Committee- Mr. Bohm updated the Committee on the budget for Green Coordinator position in the amount of \$4,000 budgeted for this year. In lieu of hiring someone, the Committee could propose green initiatives to spend those funds on.
- Food as a way to teach about different cultures & history in a healthy and fun way. Mr. Bohm said the H.S.A. reached out to see if schools are interested in partnering in a food program of some sort, perhaps also with Maschios. Mrs. Cassidy and Mr. Hendrickson said perhaps Grow a Row could be a partner on this project also. Mr. Charleston added that the No Passport Needed 7th Grade Social Studies elective could also be involved. There is also a middle school field trip to Grow a Row. The Principals meet regularly with Maschios to give input on food in cafeterias.
- TBS Forest Hill trail and Learning Woods Mr. Becker proposed the Township could apply for a grant for funding for the Department of Public Works and Facilities to revamp the Forest Hill Trail located adjacent to Three Bridges School. Dr. Higgins would be interested in such a project if the woods were cleaned up and trails clearly marked.
- 6. Solar- Mr. Bohm gave an update on the district's solar project. Financing has been secured. Submittals are at the state. Financier and company says they have all approvals needed to meet the July 2026 deadline.
