EDL Class Offerings for the 25/26 School Year

Dungeons and Dragons (D&D)/Board Games

Open to all grade levels

Welcome to Dungeons & Dragons & Board Games! In this class we'll be playing the classic tabletop roleplaying game and learning all about storytelling while we do it. Create characters, experience action and magic, and collaboratively craft epic stories all our own. We'll also explore other board and card games beyond the fantasy realm if students are interested - come join the adventure!

Theater Appreciation/Murray Spring Musical

Open to all grade levels

Do you dream of being an actor? Are you interested in learning the craft of performing on stage, understanding how the theater works or learning how to critique and love the theater? Then come join us in theater appreciation and prepare for auditioning for the Murray Spring Musical! In this class we will explore how to read scripts, understand stage directions and explore how to choose monologues and readings to best highlight your skills during auditions. In November/December we will start auditioning for the show and rehearsing for our musical performances in March!

Stage Production/ Murray Crew Crew

Open to all grade levels (there is an application process for this class)

Do you like to create different worlds, but you don't want to be on stage in front of an audience? Then Murray Crew Crew and stage production may be what you are looking for! In this class we will explore how to design, build, and decorate the stage and props for the Murray Musical. This is a great opportunity to learn a variety of skills that you will use over your lifetime. We will start creating the set and props for the musical in January and help backstage during the performances in March. Application forms can be found outside of room 2109.



Lego League

Open to all grade levels

Learn how to build and program your own Lego robot! Compete with other schools to see who has the best invention! Lego League team members will be selected by the teachers after the first couple weeks of class.

First Tech Challenge (FTC)

Open to 7th and 8th grade only

FIRST Tech Challenge students learn to think like engineers. Teams design, build, and code robots to compete in an alliance format against other teams. Robots are built from a reusable platform, powered by Android technology, and can be coded using a variety of levels of Java-based programming.

Debate

Open to all grade levels

Do you like to prove your point? Do you like to research and compete? Then debate is the place for you!! Join our very successful Murray Debate team. The skills of creating a claim and counterclaim, providing evidence, supporting your responses and writing out your argument are all skills that will help you in school but are done in a fun manner!

Knitting

Open to all grade levels

Do you want to learn the craft of knitting or dive into exploring the events that have shaped our world? Then this class is for you! Knitting is the exploration of math to create masterpieces.



History Day

Open to all grade levels (will not start until the second semester)

History Day provides support in writing and presenting research on the topic for the year. Murray has a strong and robust History Day tradition with many of our students moving onto local, regional, state competitions and beyond. Discover how past events impact us even today.

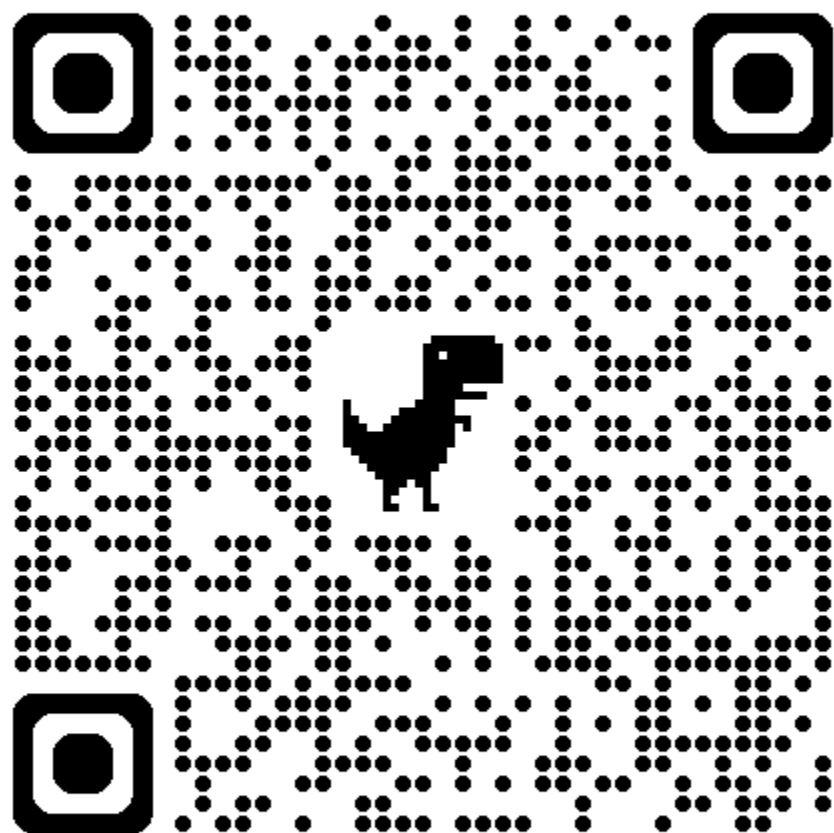
Latino Roots

Open to all grade levels

Come to this class ready to speak Spanish, this EDL course will be in Spanish for our Spanish speaking students. We will be learning about entrepreneurship, resources for Latinos in the US, how to be successful in education as a US student, and community building.

Sixth Grade

English Language Arts with Ms. Williams:

Sixth-grade students are digging into character analysis with our Deep Study of Character unit in Readers Workshop. Please feel free to reach out to your student about the book they are reading.

In the Writers Workshop, students are creating argument essays in an Essay Boot Camp unit, designed to equip them with the tools needed to write an essay.

Seventh Grade

Science with Ms. Dooley and Mr. Altringer:

The students are learning about Chemical Reactions. They have discovered the specific substances that make bath bombs fizz in water and are now doing investigations to see which gas is coming off. There are a lot of hands-on labs where we collect data to support our claims.

The classes all had the chance to visit Belwin Outdoor Learning center recently to study water quality and what invertebrates live in different healthy waters. We are doing this in preparation for the arrival of this year's Trout in the Classroom eggs. We will receive a few hundred eggs next month and will observe the eggs as they hatch and develop into trout that are large enough to release. In May, we'll do a whole-grade field trip day to release the trout and do several related outdoor activities.

Eighth Grade

Science with Ms. Dooley and Ms. Atkinson:

The students have just completed their mid-unit assessments for the Contact Forces unit. We are looking at different factors that affect whether something breaks when it collides with another thing. We've been doing a lot of crashing things together and are learning how to measure peak forces. The second half of the unit will focus on how to prevent things from breaking when they collide.

Lastly, we have two school-based mental health therapists, Ms. Sarah Beam and Ms. Rachel Howard. Sarah works with us through our partnership with ChangeInc and Rachel works with us through LifeStance. Sarah is at Murray every day, and Rachel is at Murray most days. Their offices are in our main office, and they do their therapy sessions during the school day in the school! Please connect with a Murray counselor or social worker to put in a referral for your child to work with Sarah or Rachel, or to talk more about therapeutic options.

Today, October 10th, is World Mental Health Day. It is so important to remember that there are adults for your middle schoolers to talk to at school about mental health. At Murray, we have School Counselors, School Social Workers and School-Based Therapists (a referral would need to be filled out for meeting with a School-Based Therapist). Please reach out to School Counselors and/or School Social Workers to determine if the next step should be a referral to a School-Based Therapist. Students have also been taught about filling out the QR code to speak with a School Counselor if they need support.

The month of October is Bullying Prevention Month, sponsored by Pacer's National Bullying Prevention Center. While every day is a day to prevent bullying and there are classroom lessons about Bullying Prevention, the month of October creates even more awareness around the topic of bullying. October 22nd of this year is Unity Day, a day where adults and students can wear orange to advocate for bullying to stop. PARENT'S RIGHT TO KNOW TEACHER AND PARAPROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

Under the *Every Student Succeeds Act*, parents have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of their student's classroom teachers and paraprofessionals. Parents who would like to receive this information should write to the Human Resource Department, Attn: ESSA Teacher Qualifications, Saint Paul Public Schools, 360 Colborne Street, Saint Paul, MN 55102-3299. You have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teacher(s).

- Information about whether the teacher has met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- Information about whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;
- Information about whether the teacher is teaching (subjects or content) in which proper certification is held by the teacher.
- Information about whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

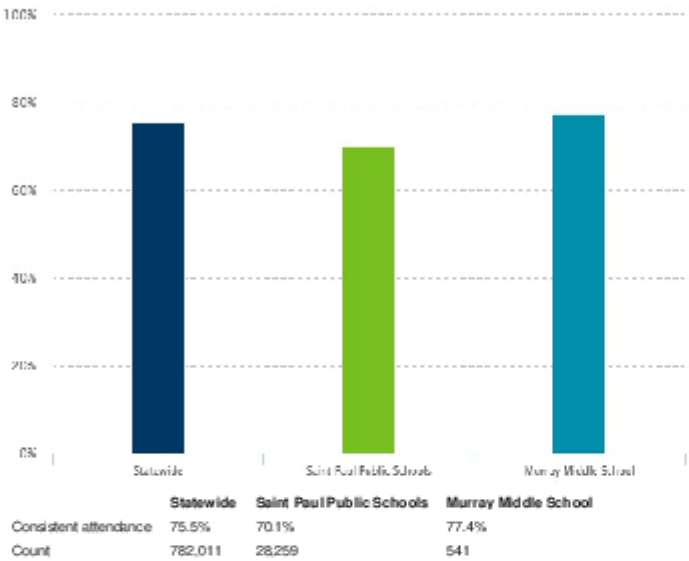

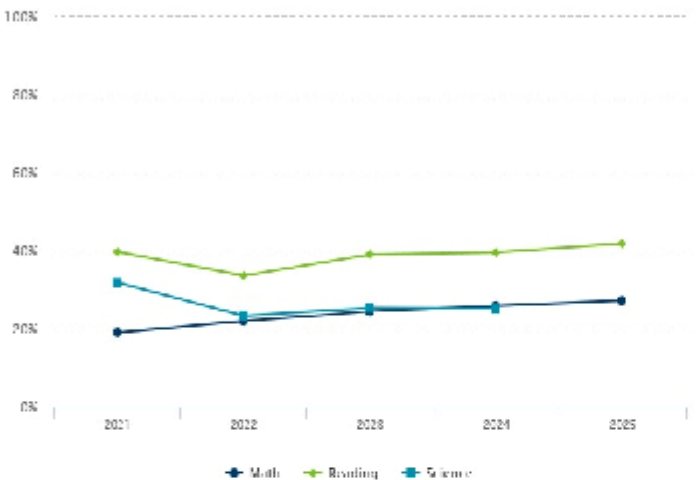


The number of students attending school regularly (2024)
