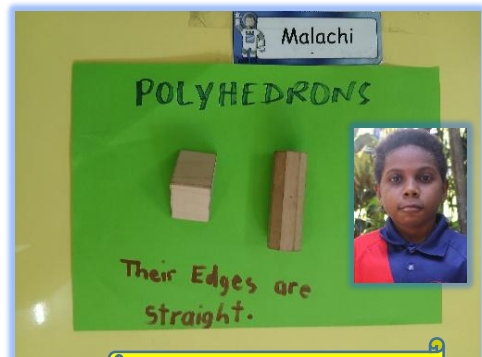

A quick Reflection on our Growth in 5TA Class

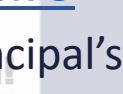
