The Board of Trustees of The American School in London joins with friends and relatives to mourn those from our school community who were so tragically killed in the plane disaster near Paris on March 3rd. Perhaps because we are all visitors here, we feel a special closeness to each other and we sense a very personal loss when tragedy such as this strikes any one of us.

The Board, itself, has lost Dr. Wayne Wilcox, who in addition to his many other extraordinary accomplishments in the academic and diplomatic fields, served with distinction for three years as a Trustee of the School, helping us through many troubled times with his clear thinking and keen wit.

The regular monthly meeting of the Board was held at the United States Embassy on Tuesday, February 19, 1974. Welcomed as a new member was Mr. Leonard M. Rickards, Senior Vice President, Exploration and Production of Phillips Petroleum Company - Europe Africa. The Board also elected to membership to fill one of the remaining vacancies, Sir Frederick Dainton, Chairman, of the University Grants' Committee of the United Kingdom. Sir Frederick, in addition to being one of Britain's most highly regarded educators, has been long associated with American educational institutions.

Harold T. Cruikshank, newly elected Chairman of the Board, announced committee assignments for the coming year. Of special interest was the formation of an Academic Committee which 'shall evaluate the curriculum, scholastic objectives and accreditation. It shall evaluate the need for additional educational programs and facilities. It shall make recommendations to the Board on Admissions Policy and keep it advised on the effects of such policy'. The Chairman of this committee is to be appointed.
