Restorative Justice Prep Sheet: Thinking About What Happened

A. The Incident (What Happened)

1. What happened, exactly? (Describe the event in your own words.)
2. Who else was involved or present when this happened?
3. If you had a chance to go back and pause at the moment you made the choice, what would you do differently?

B. Understanding the Impact (The Harm)

4. How do you think your actions affected the other person(s) involved (their feelings, their safety, their ability to learn)?
5. How did your actions affect the school environment (the classroom, the hallway, the lunchroom)?
6. How did your actions affect you?

C. Repair and Prevention (Making it Right)

7. What do you think needs to be done to ****repair the harm****? What can you do to make things better for the person(s) you affected? (Be specific—e.g., "I will clean up the mess," "I will apologize directly.")
8. What did you learn from this situation?
9. What is your ****plan**** for making sure this does not happen again? What specific strategies, rules, or supports do you need to follow?
