The team also reviewed and addressed parent survey results at this meeting.

During our Spring Parent Advisory meeting, the team evaluated the program for the 2023-2024 school year and discussed changes that needed to be made. The team also reviewed and addressed parent survey results at this meeting. Suggested improvements for the family engagement/involvement policy was discussed at this meeting. One of the biggest concerns at these meetings and on the survey was addressing the scheduling issue with only having one intervention teacher and para, so the teachers continue to provide small group intervention in the general education classrooms.

This year, we will be adding a quarterly parent evening that will include information to share with parents regarding CSIP goals, how to read assessment results, and individual progress conversations, as needed.

We are available at anytime to discuss these issues with parents. ClassDojo has proven to be a helpful tool in gaining parent input and collaborating with parents regularly. We also utilize Google Classroom for communication.

These materials are included in our updated Title 1 handbook that goes home to all students. We send home instructional information in classrooms and put information (reading strategies, upcoming meeting information, event updates, etc.) out to families quarterly.

We are also available at anytime to discuss these issues with parents.
