**CALL TO ORDER** — The Board of School Directors of the Fox Chapel Area School District held its regular business meeting at Fox Chapel Area High School October 13, 2025. President Marybeth Dadd called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. Also in attendance were Assistant Secretary Vanessa K. Lynch; Treasurer Eric G. Hamilton; Amy B. Cooper; Katie Findley; Adam G. Goode; Jessica Haselkorn, Ph.D.; and Ariel Zych.

## **GUESTS**

**Certificates of Merit** — The Board presented certificates of merit to the following students:

• Ten Fox Chapel Area High School seniors have been designated as National Merit Semifinalists and 17 were named Commended Students in the 2026 National Merit Scholarship Program. The Semifinalists from Fox Chapel Area High School are **Michael Costello, Riley Hemingray, Alan Jiang, Eloise Johnson, Ulyana Kubini, Joanna Li, Gavin Lynch, Rodrigo Silva, Yash Tahiliani, and Helen Xu**. The Commended Students from Fox Chapel Area High School are **Marin Airik, Arman Alborzi, Tobias Conklin, Greta Erdner, Laila Golla, Charles Hahl, Nora Kelley, Steven Li, James Manges, Max Melocchi, August Mierwald, Dayna Mullan, Zehra Ozkaya, Zachary Rubin, Joshua Shah, Joseph Shin, and Ian Wellman**.

All of these students were selected based on their 2024 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) scores. Each year, more than 1.3 million juniors complete the PSAT/NMSQT and are automatically entered in the National Merit Scholarship Program. Approximately 16,000 advance to become Semifinalists and about 34,000 are Commended. The Semifinalists represent less than one percent of the nation's high school seniors and the Commended Students scored in the top 5%. A Semifinalist must have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by a high school official, write an essay, and earn SAT or ACT scores that confirm the student's earlier performance on the qualifying test. Semifinalists must also participate in school and community activities, demonstrate leadership abilities, and receive other awards and honors. The Commended Students are recognized for their exceptional academic promise.

The Semifinalists now have the opportunity to advance to the Finalist level and compete for some 6,930 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$26 million to be offered in the spring of 2026.

### • **FCASD Receives Purple Star Designation**

The Fox Chapel Area School District has been awarded the Purple Star School designation by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Fox Chapel Area's designation will begin January 1, 2026, and last through December 31, 2029.

Purple Star Schools is a program that supports military-connected children as they relocate to new schools due to a parent's change in duty station. This designation is given to Local Education Agencies (LEAs) and schools for their commitment to serving active-duty military families and students through efforts including designating a military liaison and providing a transition initiative.

To achieve Purple Star School designation, LEAs and schools must meet multiple criteria, including designating a staff member as a military liaison, detailing how the LEA or school identifies military-connected students, maintaining a publicly accessible web page to provide resources for military-connected students and their parents/guardians, and providing a transition initiative led by students.

#### • **Art Teacher Chosen for Junk Kouture Advisory Board**

Fox Chapel Area High School art teacher **Joan Marangoni** was selected to serve on the first ever United States Junk Kouture Teacher Advisory Board. She is one of only six educators from across the nation who will serve on the board for the 2025-2026 school year and Marangoni was selected for being “an influential and passionate Junk Kouture Educator.” The board members will meet several times throughout the year to build a collection of feedback and published pieces that support the work of Junk Kouture.

Junk Kouture is an international sustainable fashion competition open to students ages 13-19 that challenges young people to create high-fashion designs from 100% recycled materials. The creations showcase the creativity, innovation, and environmental consciousness driving the next generation of changemakers. The competition is organized by Junk Kouture Operations Ireland Ltd. and is the largest sustainable fashion competition for young people.

During the last few years, Mrs. Marangoni and Fox Chapel Area High School art teacher **Christine Smith**, have worked with several students who have made it to the Junk Kouture national competition and World Finals. This school year, seniors **Raina Guzman** and **Claire Conti** qualified for the national contest and have qualified for worlds. During the 2023-2024 school year, then sophomores **Lily McLaughlin** and **Ayla Ojanen** made it to the national finals and then qualified for the world competition which took place in Dublin, Ireland. Lily and Ayla, now seniors and helped by senior **Katie Siddons**, also qualified for nationals this current school year. The first year a Fox Chapel Area student competed was during the 2022-2023 school year when then senior **Marley Pistella** (Class of 2023) qualified for the national competition.

#### • **Student Named Among Top 300 in National Science Competition**

Fox Chapel Area High School ninth-grader **Rishabh Krishnamurthy** was named one of the Top 300 Junior Innovators in the 2025 Thermo Fisher Scientific Junior Innovators Challenge (Thermo Fisher JIC) for the third consecutive year. Thermo Fisher JIC is the nation’s premier science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) competition for middle school students and the Top 300 represent the best and brightest middle school STEM talent in the United States and its territories. The Thermo Fisher JIC, a program of Society for Science, inspires young scientists, engineers, and innovators to solve the grand challenges of the future.

The Top 300 Junior Innovators (including six from Pennsylvania) were selected from nearly 2,000 entrants from 48 states, American Samoa, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands, and Puerto Rico who applied to compete in the Thermo Fisher JIC. Students who place in the top 10% of their local science fair are eligible to enter the contest. Rishabh was chosen based on his project “Robots: Filling the Human Void,” for which he was awarded a first place in the Pittsburgh Regional Science and Engineering Fair in April 2025 when he was an eighth-grader at Dorseyville Middle School.

“These young innovators embody the most promising science and engineering talent in the nation,” said Maya Ajmera, president and CEO, Society for Science and executive publisher, Science News. “They are taking on complex challenges and demonstrating a passion for STEM that can lead to impactful change. I am thrilled to celebrate their achievements.”

“We are inspired by the creativity and determination of the Top 300 Junior Innovators, whose projects reflect a true passion for solving real-world challenges,” said Dr. Karen Nelson, chief scientific officer, Thermo Fisher Scientific. “Recognizing and supporting young scientific minds is essential to fostering the next generation of innovators who will shape a brighter, more collaborative future for us all.”

Each of the Top 300 Junior Innovators received a \$125 award from Department of Defense (DoD) STEM, as well as a special prize package.

**Additional School Bus Drivers – 2025-2026 School Year** — Ratified hiring the additional ABC Transit, Inc., drivers from the list effective for the 2025-2026 school year. All required licensing, clearances, and all other essential employment requirements for school bus operators under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania have been verified.
