October Flu Shot Clinics



Again this year, Scarborough Public Schools, in conjunction with Maine Health, will be offering flu prevention clinics at all of the schools in October.

There are **two (2) forms** that must be completed for your child to receive an influenza vaccination, a consent form and an insurance information form. Links are here: [Consent Form](#) and [Insurance Form](#)

Your child's school will be sending out more detailed information for families.

Here are the clinic dates for students at each school:

- High School: October 14, 2025 starting at 8:30am. Return forms by October 7th
- Middle School: October 15, 2025 starting at 8:30am. Return forms by October 8th
- **Wentworth School: October 17, 2025 starting at 9:00am. Return forms by October 15th**
- Blue Point School: October 14, 2025 starting at 11:30am. Return forms by October 7th
- Eight Corners School: October 15, 2025 starting at 11:30am. Return forms by October 8th
- **Pleasant Hill School: October 17, 2024 starting at 10:00am. Return forms by October 15th - TIME CORRECTION**

Information from Scarborough's Health Services

When is sick too sick for school?

A regular attendance routine is important for your child's well-being and learning. These tips can help you decide when to keep your child home when they don't feel well.



SEND ME TO SCHOOL IF...

- I have a **runny nose** or just a **little cough**, but no other symptoms.
- I have **NOT had a fever overnight** and **have NOT taken fever reducing medicine** during that time.
- I have a **mild stomach ache**.
- I have **not thrown up** overnight and can drink liquids without throwing up.
- I have a **mild rash** and no other symptoms.
- I have **eye drainage WITHOUT fever**, eye pain or eyelid redness.



KEEP ME AT HOME IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 100.4**
- I have **thrown up two or more times** in the past 24 hours.
- My **stool is watery** and I may not make it to the bathroom in time.



SEEK MEDICAL CARE IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 100.4 AND any of the following:** ear pain, sore throat, rash, stomachache, headache or tooth pain.
- I have **stomach pain and fever**, I have **bloody or black stool**, or I am **dehydrated** (tired and sleepy, dry mouth) and/or I have **not urinated** in the last 8 hours.
- I have a **persistent cough** or **trouble breathing**, or have a fever with the cough.
- I have **eye swelling, eye pain** or an **eye injury**.
- I have a **rash that has blisters**, is draining, is painful, looks like bruises, and/or I have a fever with the rash.

If you don't know whether to send your child to school, have specific concerns regarding your child's physical or mental health, or are worried your child will spread illness, contact your child's health care provider, a local urgent care or the school nurse. These tips are not meant to take the place of local health department/school district health guidance including about contagious illnesses such as Covid-19 and the flu.

A COMMUNITY-LED PROCESS



After the failure of the 2023 school referendum, the School Board & Town Council created a citizen committee—the School Building Advisory Committee (SBAC)—to find a new solution.

The SBAC spent nearly 18 months exploring a wide range of options with frequent community input along the way.

MAJOR CHALLENGES FACING OUR K-8 SCHOOLS

Over Capacity & Overcrowded



Our K-2 primary schools and middle school are already operating over capacity, and temporary modular classrooms have been in daily use for over 20 years. Based on children who have already been born in Scarborough, we expect an increase of almost 200 students to enter the primary schools by 2028-2029.

Competing Uses of Space



Spaces shared by multiple programs (such as gym/cafeteria, art/music, etc.) can inhibit programming due to time spent transitioning between uses or difficulty accommodating certain equipment or materials. Increasing enrollment will continue to exacerbate our space needs.

Aging, Outdated Facilities



The three K-2 primary schools were built in the 1950s and 60s. The outdated infrastructure does not adequately support modern teaching and learning, including special education, intervention, and state-mandated curriculum.

Increased Security Needs



Safety & security needs are different today than when our schools were originally constructed. Improvements are needed to ensure all schools have sufficient emergency site access, secure entry vestibules, lockdown zones, and other infrastructure.

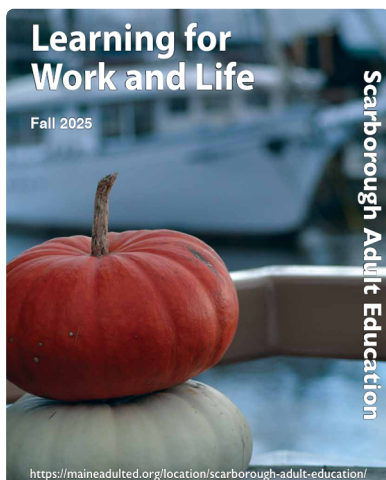
