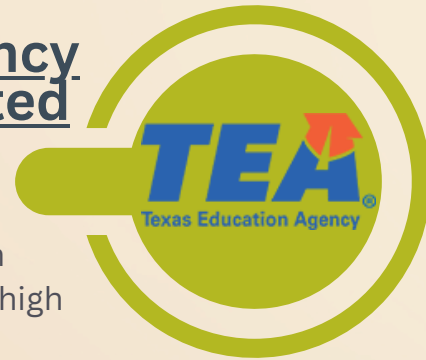

Nessy Reading and Spelling is an effective resource that covers 5 years of literacy development from Year 1 to Year 6. This link is a tool on reading and spelling rules.

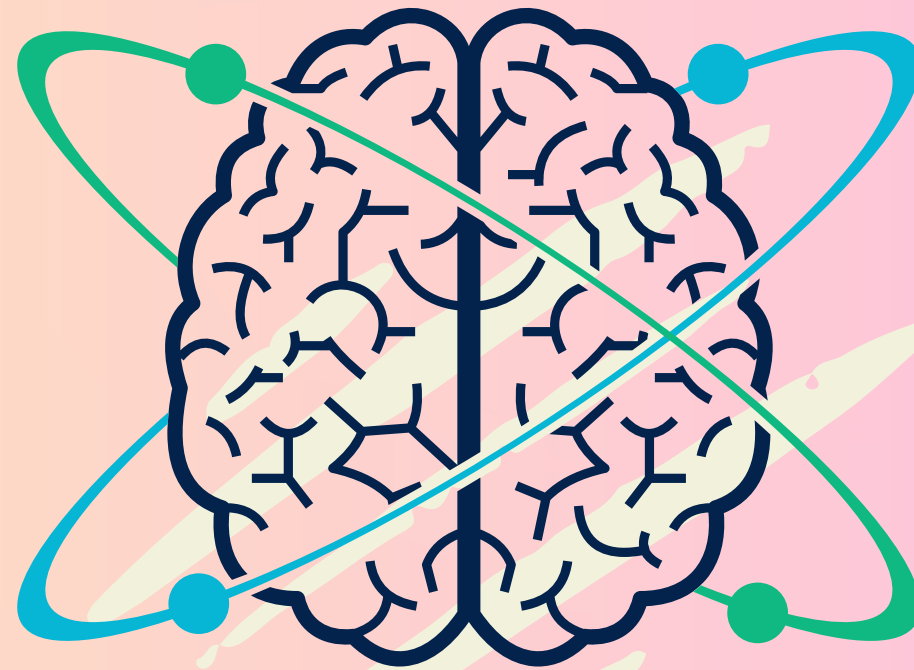


Lexico: A Dyslexia Reading Aid

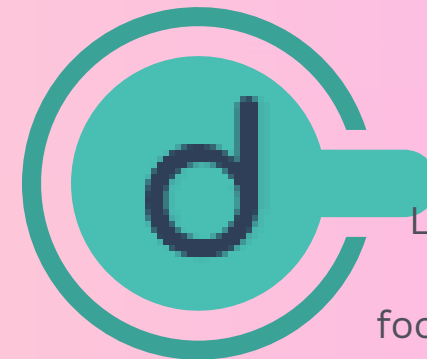
