WHEREAS, the Board wishes to explore all available educational and financial options for the students and taxpayers of the District, including but not limited to:

- 1. Continuation of the current send/receive relationship with the Newton School District;
- 2. Establishing a new send/receive relationship with another school district or districts;
- 3. Development of alternative educational arrangements; and

4. The potential severance of the existing send/receive relationship with the Newton School District; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is in the best interests of the District to solicit proposals from qualified consultants to conduct a feasibility study in accordance with New Jersey law and Department of Education requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Green Township Board of Education hereby authorizes the Business Administrator/Board Secretary to prepare and issue a Request for Proposals ("RFP") from qualified consultants to conduct a feasibility study analyzing the District's current and alternative send/receive options, including the potential severance of the existing send/receive relationship with the Newton School District; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the RFP shall be prepared and advertised in compliance with applicable statutes and regulations, and that responses shall be reviewed and evaluated in accordance with the law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the results of the feasibility study shall be reported to the Board for consideration and determination of next steps, including whether to petition the Commissioner of Education regarding the send/receive relationship.
