
- <u>Early Action</u> due Nov. 1st or 15th typically receive a response by end of Jan.



How to Apply

1. Student Submits Application

2. MHS sends required documents

3. College completes file and updates status for student

Either via Common App or the college's own online application, the process is started once a student completes and submits their application.

Once the student ensures that their college is on their SCOIR account under APPLIED, Mahwah High School will then compile the required documents to submit to each college.

Once the student application and school documents are submitted, each individual college will communicate with the STUDENT as to the status of the application / any missing materials.



*MHS School Counseling needs 2 WEEKS notice to process documents!

Add colleges to your Common Application. Select your preferred admission plan. Ensure this is accurate so your counselor can send your documents.
☐ Find your deadlines on the Common Application. Earliest deadline is:
□ Notify your teachers who will write your letters of recommendation of your earliest deadline.
Complete your Common Application by receiving green checks under each section. Then move to the college specific questions to submit your entire application. You will be able to check your application through a pdf at this point, save it for your records.
Check which schools require score reports. Request OFFICIAL SAT and/or ACT scores to be sent to your colleges directly from the testing agencies (http://sat.collegeboard.org/ and http://actstudent.org)

*Student submits directly to college: application, application fee, essay, official score reports (if applicable), miscellaneous required components (i.e. portfolio, audition, activity sheet and/or student resume, etc.)

*School Counseling will submit directly to college: school reports, official transcript, counselor recommendation, teacher recommendations, school profile.




