# District Goals and Academics

- EMS Shortened Interim Comprehensive Assessment
  - Assessment has been completed and data will identify students in need of additional support in ELA and Math in grades 6-8
  - Additional teacher was hired to support student academics
- Benchmark assessments have been completed in AMIRA the state reading assessment grades K-5
- Fall key benchmark assessments will be used to set individual growth goals for students and for teachers
- Ramey Uriarte presentation will discuss three year mathematics plan
  - Mr. Uriarte is working directly with Instructional coaches and Regional Math Center in year two of our partnership with the state math project.
  - Staff are receiving math support in Content Modules and Instructional Coaches are receiving additional training in Fact Cycles by the Regional Math Center
    - The District has completed their second Professional development of the year with the Regional Math Team

# District Maintenance

- EHS Dome foundation report
  - Atlas Engineering report regarding stability of Dome A foundation
  - Sawtooth Survey is mapping dome movement monthly and after distinct weather events
- True North Relocation Update
- Butte View Elementary Gymnasium
  - Board priority #3 was to build a gymnasium at the Butte View Complex for students that was equitable to Shadow Butte and Carberry Elementary
  - CM Construction completed a small school gym in Payette that can be a model for the Butte View Elementary
- District Maintenance is soliciting local masonry contractors to provide work estimates to concerns identified in the 10 year maintenance plan in regard to brick mortar and crack issues at Sweet and Butte View elementary schools
- Classroom and hallway flooring removal and replacement prioritized list is being created to formalize long term schedule and plan across the district

# Upcoming Events and Miscellaneous

- House Bill 292 is a tax relief bill the ESD has used to reduce the need for supplemental levy
  - 2024 payment was approximately 1.2 million dollars
  - 2025 payment was approximately 1.9 million dollars
  - These funds are specific to Bond payments, Plant and Facilities Levies, and Supplemental Levies. If there is money after reducing those payments the funds must be used for maintenance of facilities
  - Language does not allow for HB 292 funds to be used for personnel that are not directly involved in maintenance. We are unable to use even a portion of these funds to cover Custodial costs or other cost the Board sets as a priority
