



★ **ISIP Reading Scores** - 4th and 5th are using IXL to Benchmark students for the fall and will use their diagnostic scores to watch progress.





★ **IXL Math (Grades 2nd-5th)**


Percentile ranks

★ Behavioral/PBIS Updates -

The staff that participated in the Help for Billy/Classroom 180 (Trauma Informed Classroom) by Heather Forbes, presented at the beginning of the year training days. In the book and trainings, Billy is a student who is affected by trauma and therefore has a shorter window of opportunity to work with the student on behavior before they reach a proverbial breaking point. While students who have less trauma in their lives are referred to being Andy's, or students who have a great capacity or window of opportunity for correction, and don't see their situation as a fight or flight response. Our PBIS and leadership teams are working on our next level of support for PBIS and how we support teachers by helping them understand the students and what they need, but also helping teachers understand what they need in different situations.

At Carberry, we have the T3+ students as well as T3 and we are finding that there are children who are coming in the school environment not ready to be “students” and what it means to be a part of the school family. We spend time talking with them during our SEL time about what it means to be a part of the school community and things that are okay at home are not always acceptable at school. Such as language and demanding their way from those around them. Greg is currently working with Nicole Thomas, Special Education Director and Craig Woods, Superintendent on how we could provide a place for students who aren't quite ready for a full classroom environment. Some districts have more resources and we have looked at some of those programs but we need to work towards one for Emmett as the other elementary schools have students with similar needs. Parents don't always have the tools to work with their children to get them ready for school and need our collective support and resources to help provide training for them and their to be students as well.

★ **Events Past/Upcoming**

Our 4th and 5th grade students will be having Wagon's Ho event on October 30th. This pioneer hands on experience is usually a 4th grade program but we haven't had them out while I have been here and we want our older 5th grade students to not miss out. We are needing several volunteers and if you would like to volunteer or come and observe this event it starts at 8:45 and ends at 2:30pm, just in time for Trunk or Treat which will be in the East side parking lot from 2:00 to 3:15pm. We are loving the Parent Square app as our teachers are communicating with parents daily and our Newsletters go out monthly. Please let me know if you are not getting the Carberry school posts and we will get you set up.

★ **Staff Highlight Certified/Classified**

Lynn Horton for helping put together the presentation of Classroom 180 training at the beginning of the year and for all the extra work she has been doing to support our Advanced Tiers of PBIS. There are so many ways that she has stepped up to support our kids and teachers. It is just remarkable.

This is a shout out to all our paraprofessionals that work with our students in small groups, one on one and help the students feel welcomed and loved each day. I am very thankful for all the staff at Carberry and what teachers and paras do on a daily basis is very challenging and exhausting but they keep coming back, and I appreciate that.
