Although it's been just a short while since our last meeting, I'm thrilled to share some exciting updates and events that await us.

First, I'd like to highlight that today marks National Suicide Prevention Day, and September is dedicated to Suicide Prevention Awareness. Our district is privileged to have a dedicated department for counseling and social services, a rarity among districts. This department is fully engaged in organizing various events and disseminating vital information throughout this month. Notably, tomorrow is the annual Teen Mental Health Summit, an event that will see significant participation from CUSD students.

If you or a loved one is struggling with thoughts of suicide, The Hope Institute in CUSD is available to support you. The Hope Institute provides specialized treatment for those experiencing thoughts of suicide. Clinicians offer short-term outpatient care that includes individual, group, and family counseling. Appointments are offered within 24-48 business hours and clients can be seen up to 3x a week for as long as services are needed. ANY Individual (children, teens, and adults) in our community struggling with suicidal ideation can attend The Hope Institute to reduce suicidal risk, increase hope, and obtain a referral to ongoing counseling as needed. Last night at the Town of Gilbert Council meeting The Hope Institute staff accepted the National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month Proclamation from the Town. Congratulations!

Tomorrow, September 11, is Patriots' Day, a somber occasion dedicated to remembering the events of 9/11. CUSD schools will be hosting events to honor our heroes, including first responders, and to remember the many lives lost on that tragic day.

7.01 CUSD 301 Pay for Performance (PFP)

A.R.S. 15-977 (Classroom Site Fund) requires that a school district governing board must adopt a performance-based compensation system in order to allocate funding from the classroom site fund. The 2025-2026 Proposition 301 Pay for Performance Plan has been approved by the District's SuperProp Committee.

The requirements for this stipend will be awarded in three (3) parts aligned with the district and state mandates:

1. (\$350) for completion of the Site Learning Experience plan requirements
2. (\$350) for Evaluation Performance Classification
 - Highly effective and effective teachers will receive 100%; developing teachers (in their first two years) receive 75%; developing teachers (with 3+ years of experience) receive 50%; and ineffective teachers receive 0%.
3. (\$2750) Journey to Excellence - Participation in Learning Walks (\$1375 will be paid out at the end of semester 1, \$1375 will be paid out at the end of semester 2)

Approval of this performance-based compensation system will be requested during the October 8, 2025 Regular Board Meeting.

9.06 Revision of Policy 5-201 Patriotic Exercises and Observance Days

2025 Ariz. Sess. Laws 2 (Senate Bill 1225) clarifies the requirements of A.R.S. § 15-710.02 regarding instruction pertaining to terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. The Trust recommends a new title and revisions to Policy 5-201 to reflect an observance day for 9-11 and Sandra Day O'Connor Civics Celebrations on September 25th. This legislation carried an emergency clause and is effective now.

Chandler School District recommended adopting Policy 5-201 as proposed by The Trust.

9.07 Revision of Policy 5-203 Students with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)

2025 Ariz. Sess. Laws 196 (House Bill 2170) amends A.R.S. § 15-763 to require school districts to state in an individualized education plan (IEP) whether a student with a specific learning disability has been diagnosed with dyslexia.

The State Board of Education adopted revisions to Ariz. Admin Code R7-2-401(E)(4) on June 23, 2025, which require school districts to publish evaluation procedures for the evaluation of special education eligibility on the district's website and address timing of communication regarding the evaluation process.

The Trust recommended changes to Policy 5-203 to reflect these Arizona specific requirements. The Trust has also edited the policy for additional clarity. Chandler School District recommended adopting Policy 5-203 as proposed by The Trust.

9.08 Policy 5-216.01 (NEW) Assessments

2025 Ariz. Sess. Laws 204 (House Bill 2540) revised A.R.S. § 15-741 regarding testing prescribed by the State Board of Education. High school students may submit scores from nationally recognized assessments and opt out of State Board prescribed testing. The Trust recommends the adoption of a new policy to address the requirements.

Chandler School District recommended adopting Policy 5-216.01 as proposed by The Trust.

9.09 Revision of Policy 5-404 Administration of Medicine

2025 Ariz. Sess. Laws 104 (Senate Bill 1440) amends multiple statutes to reflect a revised definition of an epinephrine delivery system as defined in A.R.S. § 36-2201 (removing use of the word "auto-injector"). The Trust has proposed conforming changes to policy and procedure.

Chandler School District recommended adopting Policy 5-404 as proposed by The Trust with one minor edit, the District is recommending using the word "administering" instead of "injecting" on item number 3 in page 3.

9.10 Reported Grade Level Change for Basha High School and Ken 'Chief' Hill Learning Academy

The District is requesting approval to modify the grade levels served for the following sites. Basha High School and Ken 'Chief' Hill Learning Academy are currently reported to enroll students grades as PS-12 and 7-12, respectfully, at the Arizona Department of Education. However, Basha High School only services students in grades 6-12. Ken 'Chief' Hill Learning Academy will only service students in grades 9-12.

The School Facilities Board (SFB) and Arizona Department of Education (ADE) require a Governing Board resolution to update their database with the new grade level configurations.

The Administration requested that the Governing Board approve the change of our state reported grade levels to 6-12 for Basha High School and 9-12 for Ken 'Chief' Hill Learning Academy to accurately reflect the students served at these sites.

Pursuant to ARS §15-973.C, a district may petition the Superintendent of Public Instruction for advance payment of State Aid if current obligations are such that apportionments prescribed in ARS § 15-973.B will not be made in a timely manner to meet those obligations and so long as no more than three-fourths of the total State Aid apportionment is received prior to April 15 of the fiscal year.

By so doing, the District will reduce the need for registering Warrants and Tax Anticipation Notes, resulting in savings to the District. Therefore, it was recommended the Board approve a Resolution petitioning the Superintendent of Public Instruction for advance payment of State Aid.

11.01 Revision of Policy 1-302 Governing Board Meetings and Open Meeting Law

2025 Ariz. Sess. Law 168 (House Bill 2231) created an open meeting law exemption for communication between a quorum of a three member advisory committee if not more than one member of the committee is a governing board member. The Trust recommends an update to the Policy 1-302 to reflect this exemption. The Trust has also edited for additional clarity.

Chandler School District recommended adopting the policy as proposed by The Trust. These changes are presented as information and approval of Policy 1-302 will be requested at the October 8, 2025, Board meeting.

11.02 Revision of Policy 1-401 Parents/Legal Guardian Rights in Education

2025 Ariz. Sess. Law 188 (Senate Bill 2231) permits parents/legal guardians to request the health care credentials for employees or individuals who provide health services to students. Parents may also request information regarding a school employee's emergency response training. The Trust recommends revision to Policy 1-401.

The Trust also recommends revisions to Procedure 1-401.A based on a recommendation from a member and policy number alignment.

Chandler School District recommends adopting the policy as proposed by The Trust. These changes are presented as information and approval of Policy 1-401 will be requested at the October 8, 2025, Board meeting. Procedures are presented as information and do not require Board approval. 2025 Ariz. Sess. Law 188 (Senate Bill 2231) permits parents/legal guardians to request the health care credentials for employees or individuals who provide health services to students. Parents may also request information regarding a school employee's emergency response training. The Trust recommended revision to Policy 1-401.

Districts are required to train any officer employed (directly or indirectly) regarding how to recognize and interact with students with disabilities. Other training is required if the district receives a school safety grant.

Beginning in June 2026, all law enforcement and security personnel will be required to complete ADE approved training to be developed in coordination with the Arizona Peace Officers Standards and

11.05 Revision of Procedure 3-402.A Records-Disclosure of Public Records 2025 Ariz. Sess. Laws 102 (Senate Bill 1372) amends the Public Records Act at A.R.S. § 39-121.01(D) to require requesting parties to identify their intended use of records if requested for a commercial purpose. The Trust proposes a revision to an existing procedure.

These changes were presented as information as procedures do not require Board approval.

11.06 Revision of Policy 5-401 Police Interview Notification 2025 Ariz. Sess. Laws 220 (House Bill 2779) requires school districts to immediately notify parents, legal guardians and/or custodians if law enforcement takes a juvenile into temporary custody after confirming with law enforcement that the notification does not pose a risk to the student or to the investigation. Proposed policy changes reflect this new requirement.

Chandler School District recommended adopting the policy as proposed by The Trust. These changes were presented as information and approval of Policy 5-401 will be requested at the October 8, 2025, Board meeting.

11.07 Revision of Policy 5-402 Department of Child Safety Interview and Custody 2025 Ariz. Sess. Laws 161 (Senate Bill 1493) clarifies that a Department of Child Safety (DCS) caseworker may be required to present their official DCS identification upon a school visit and a valid driver license. Schools may not keep digital or physical copies of the personal information of the DCS caseworker. The Trust has proposed conforming policy changes.

Chandler School District recommended adopting the policy as proposed by The Trust. These changes were presented as information and approval of Policy 5-402 will be requested at the October 8, 2025, Board meeting.

11.08 Revision of Policy 5-410 Interscholastic Athletics 2025 Ariz. Sess. Laws 242 (Senate Bill 1744) will add A.R.S. § 15-120.07, effective August 1, 2026. Districts that provide athletic instruction in grades 9-12 and that sponsor athletic teams or sports programs will be required to have automated external defibrillators on each campus and at each event, including all practices, trainings and competitions.
