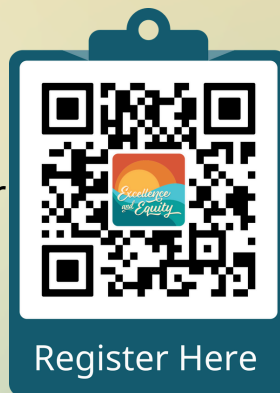
Partnering With Families for Student Success

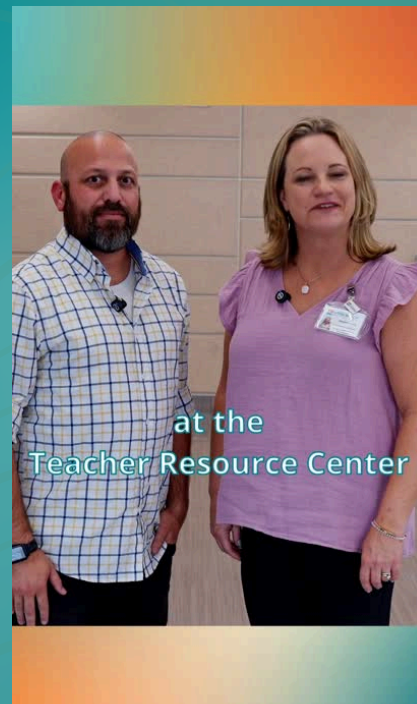

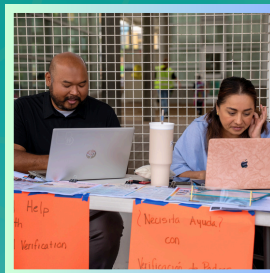
Free TB Testing for VIPS – A Huge Success!

LBUSD Launches New Device Use and Social Media Safety Policy

On September 3, 2025, LBUSD's Board of Education approved Policy 5131.8: Reclaiming Attention – Limiting Distractions and Supporting Wellness,

in response to California AB 2136, which requires schools to limit student phone use during the day. Pilot schools have already seen strong results, and full district-wide implementation begins January 26, 2026. To support students and families, LBUSD is launching an education campaign on the risks of device overuse and strategies for safe online and social media use.
