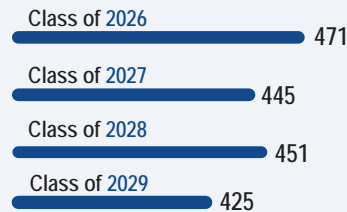
### OVERVIEW

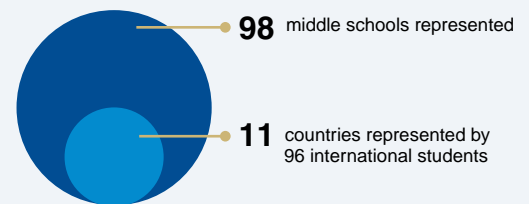

#### SCHEDULE

- School year includes: 2 semesters comprised of approximately 18 weeks
- Modified Block Schedule: 75-minute periods four days a week and one all-periods day per week with 45-minute periods. Classes meet three times per week.
- All students must take seven courses per semester (9th-12th grade)

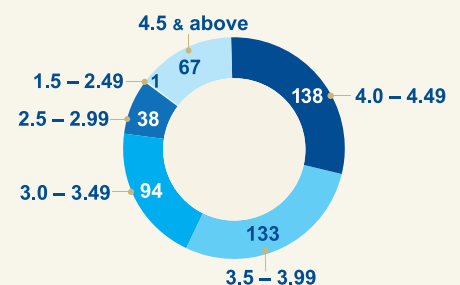

# TESTING DATA & ADVANCED COURSES

## AP TESTING (2025)

All SM students enrolled in an AP class are required to sit for the corresponding AP exam. Students are not allowed to self-study for an additional exam and take it at SM (must enroll at a different location).

- 1,388 total exams were administered
  - 306 exams received a score of 5 (26%)
  - 550 exams received a score of 4 (40%)
  - 366 exams received a score of 3 (22%)
- 305 AP Scholars (2025) – must earn a 3 or higher on at least 3 exams (10% nationwide receive this distinction)
- Total AP Courses Offered – 24 courses
- Total AP Enrollment – 694 students
- 51% of students in 10th-12th took at least one AP class in 2024-25

# INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAMME

SMCHS is one of the four Catholic high schools in California to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IBDP). The IB Diploma Program is a two-year academic program for 11th and 12th graders that attracts a diverse group of learners committed to challenging themselves with a highly rigorous curriculum that focuses on in-depth critical thinking, balanced perspectives, global-mindedness, and acquisition of knowledge to prepare them for their current and future learning. IB Diploma students may qualify for advanced standing and/or earn credits at many colleges and universities. IB Diploma and anticipated candidates (11th and 12th grade), in addition to their coursework of six IB classes, complete the core requirements:



- **Theory of Knowledge (TOK)** – a seminar course to apply thinking and inquiry across all subject areas to address the ideas of how we acquire knowledge and know what we know
- **Extended Essay (EE)** – a 4,000-word research paper based on a student chosen IB subject/topic centered on a student-generated inquiry/research question
- **Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS)** – student chosen experiences on and off campus meant to encourage personal growth, engagement in the community, and self-reflection

## UNIQUE IB PROGRAMME FEATURES AT SMCHS INCLUDE:

- IB students are often co-enrolled in AP courses and sit for both the IB and AP exams
- Non-IB students can take IB classes as Course Candidates
- IB Philosophy replaces the SMCHS requirement for Religion 3 and 4

## PROGRAMS AT A GLANCE



### SERVICE LEARNING IN THE SPIRIT OF THE GOSPEL

In the living out the school's charism of Caritas Christi, the love of Christ, SMCHS Campus Ministry offers its students a robust service learning program throughout all four years. Freshmen and sophomores participate in class service projects, uniquely designed within the theology curriculum to serve an underserved or vulnerable population. Sophomores partner with Second Harvest Food Bank and serve in a variety of capacities to the Orange County community. Juniors and seniors are given the freedom to complete their projects by participating in direct service work with a number of approved nonprofits in areas and issues they are interested in. Christian Service at SMCHS is integral in forming young women and men in our school's charism. Completion of grade-level service projects is a graduation requirement.



**LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES** Over 90% of SMCHS students participate in extracurricular and/or co-curricular activities, giving ample opportunities to develop leadership and management skills. Leadership roles include Peer Ministry, Associated Student Body, Link Crew, Student Ambassadors and team managers.



**MODEL UNITED NATIONS** Santa Margarita's award-winning Model United Nations program combines rigorous academics with high-level competition, preparing students to think critically, speak persuasively, and lead with confidence on a global stage. Integrated into our honors social studies curriculum and expanded through international conferences, MUN develops advanced skills in diplomacy, negotiation and collaboration. Since 2000, our delegates have earned 11,144 individual awards and 117 delegation awards, reflecting a legacy of excellence and leadership in global affairs.



**ROBOTICS/ENGINEERING** The school's award-winning robotics teams "SMbly Required" and "SMbled" function like a startup with students learning problem-solving, CAD modeling, CAM, marketing and project management. Students design, build, program, test and compete with competition-ready robots in the FIRST Robotics Competition program.



**ARTS** Visual and performing arts classes provide diverse opportunities for students to learn and express their artistic talents. Through regional and national competitions, international performances, and award-winning productions, SMCHS students share their talents with the community. The Talon Academy of Performing Arts offers an after school conservatory program.



**ATHLETICS** Since the school opened over 36 years ago, SMCHS has earned more championships than any other school in Southern California with 16 state championships, 88 CIF championships, and 259 league championships. SMCHS offers 26 CIF and 7 club programs.



**EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY** As one of 34 Microsoft Showcase Schools in the nation, SMCHS is a leader in utilizing technology to create collaborative, student-centered classrooms to improve learning outcomes. Building on this, our AI and media-literacy program pairs an updated, values-aligned AI policy with classroom tools designed for privacy and safety, preparing students to use AI responsibly for learning, creativity, and real-world problem solving.



**AUXILIARY STUDIES PROGRAM** The school's ASP department offers a comprehensive fee-based support program giving students with diagnosed learning differences the tools to succeed alongside their non-learning disabled peers.



**EAGLE ONLINE ACADEMY** SMCHS offers a fully asynchronous online school with over 70 UC Approved classes created and taught by Santa Margarita teachers. Online students have the opportunity to participate in all school activities such as athletics, theater, campus ministry and student government with access to SMCHS support services.



**NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY** NHS membership at SMCHS is highly selective. Juniors and seniors must demonstrate how their actions meet the four NHS pillars of scholarship, character, service and leadership along with a GPA requirement of 3.5. Only 15% of each class earns this distinction.



**MEDIA** Students produce a daily news broadcast show (Eagle Television), a news website (SMCHSEagleEye.com), and the award-winning Eagle Eye student newspaper. Using state-of-the-art production equipment, ETV students edit, film, write and produce content. Eagle Eye students have the opportunity to attend national journalism conferences.



**WELLNESS** SMCHS offers a comprehensive student support program comprised of mental health education, training, resources, and referrals to meet the challenges of adolescence. Four wellness counselors offer on-campus resources.

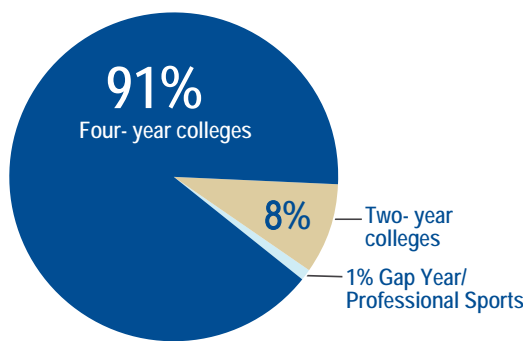
