- All students earn the American High School Diploma with the IB Diploma, the Official Peruvian Program (OPP), and the Global Impact Diploma (GID) as additional options.
- The official US State Department Office of Overseas Education School in Peru.
- All classes are offered in English, with the exception of world languages and courses designated for the Official Peruvian Program (OPP).

The majority of FDR students are fluent in English and Spanish, and pursue bilingual diplomas.



Classes meet for 80 minutes in Grades 9-12 on a rotating block schedule.



FDR supports a robust after school program and a variety of extracurricular activities, which include sports, artistic activities, and student led service projects.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM & UNIVERSITY APPLICATION POLICIES

- Co-educational, non-residential program that uses year long grading except for TOK, OPP Arts and culture, and grade 10 sciences, which are .5 credit classes.
- Grades 11 and 12 students have the option of taking non IB courses, individual IB subjects, or the full IB Diploma.
- Colegio Roosevelt does not rank its students.
- Colegio Roosevelt does not report GPA. Special requests for GPA calculations should be made to the High School counselors.
- Mid year grades are available in January.
- Colegio Roosevelt students are strongly encouraged to limit their applications to 10 globally in order to ensure best fit.
- Colegio Roosevelt reports behavioral suspensions from school or issues of academic malpractice where the university requests this information.

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SCHOOL CALENDAR

The school year consists of 180 teacher - student contact days from August through June and is divided into two semesters. The school follows the US academic calendar with students taking IB exams in May each year. As it is in the southern hemisphere, Colegio Roosevelt follows the Peruvian calendar and observes all Peruvian holidays and breaks, including an extended summer break from mid December to mid February each year. This is a hybrid calendar designed to meet the needs of both the local and international communities.

INNOVATION ACADEMY (IA)



The Innovation Academy (IA) is an interdisciplinary, research-based curriculum that allows students to work in small cohorts to complete projects that target authentic audiences. The IA has a solid service component and allows 9th and 10th graders the autonomy to work outside campus on real research and to learn from outside experts in their fields. THE GLOBAL IMPACT DIPLOMA

Starting with the graduating class of 2027 students will have the option of graduating with a Global Impact Diploma (GID) distinction. The GID is a distinction that was co-created by international schools worldwide. It is a program designed to foster agency and a sense of meaning in education.

Students pursuing the GID take 5 core GID courses and engage in specialization courses either through the International Baccalaureate, online programs, or other bespoke courses. The emphasis is on applying learning in real-world contexts through courses focused on collaboration and agency for impact. OFFICIAL PERUVIAN PROGRAM (OPP)



In addition to the US and the IB Diplomas, Colegio Roosevelt offers the Official Peruvian Program (OPP) that leads to the awarding of the Official Peruvian Certificate of Studies, which is recognized worldwide. Enrollment in the OPP is open to students who are native Spanish speakers or are highly proficient in the language. An Official Peruvian Certificate of Studies is needed for Peruvian students and other Spanish speaking students applying to Peruvian universities or universities abroad that have cultural, scientific and educational agreements with Peru.

The academic strength of our students is recognized by the top ranked Peruvian universities who consider us a "High Performing School". They regularly award our students preferential admissions benefits based on Colegio Roosevelt alumni graduates who achieve remarkable academic performance in their Houses of Studies.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADING SYSTEM

Student progress and learning are assessed using general descriptors aligned with the Colegio Roosevelt grading scale. Students are assessed on their Overall Level of Achievement (OLA). The OLA marks with their descriptors are listed below.

A note about grade equivalency: It is not possible to provide a standard comparison between IB grades and the letter grades commonly used in the US. For students moving from Colegio Roosevelt to other schools or university, Colegio Roosevelt has estimated approximate equivalencies between Colegio Roosevelt grades and other systems.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

One credit is awarded for each one-year course completed with a passing mark of 3 or above based on the Colegio Roosevelt grading scale of 2-7. One half credit is awarded for each one-semester course completed. A minimum of 24 credits is required for graduation. Students transferring to Colegio Roosevelt from another system may bring in a maximum of 8 credits per grade level. All students, regardless of their program, are expected to meet the requirements of the Colegio Roosevelt Diploma

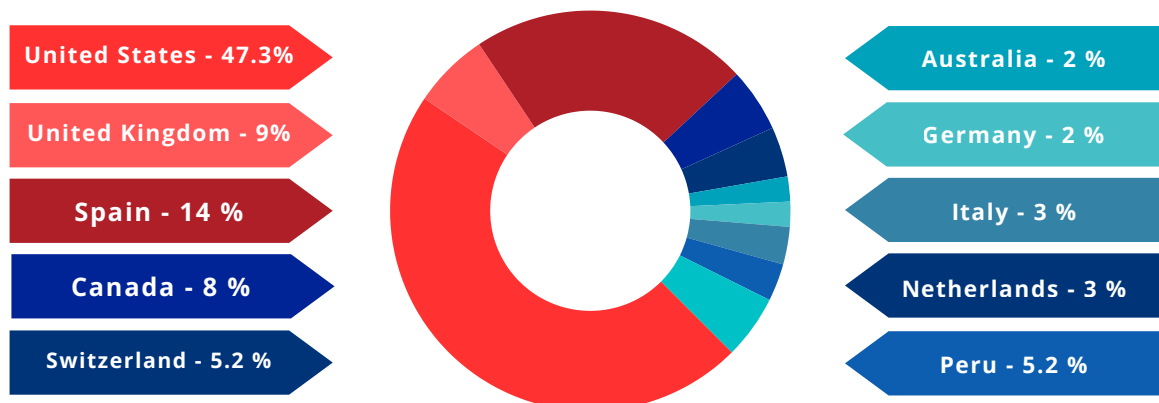
