Breakfast and lunch are free for all students in Minnesota. However, students must pay if they want an additional entree, milk for bagged lunches, or anything from the ala carte menu.

Even though meals are free for all students, we encourage families to complete the Application for Educational Benefits to receive reduced fees and discounts. Use the QR code to fill out the meal application on LINQ Connect.
