Board President's Comments

Ms. Ben-Levy welcomed everyone back, commenting on her positive outlook for the new school year ahead since everything started so beautifully. She gave credit to everyone, thanking Ms. Brown, the Administrative Team, the Board, and the entire staff for their part. She praised Mr. Szajkowski for keeping our buildings safe for everyone to return to and Mr. Macias for watching over everything. She went on to comment on how well the construction at the high school is coming along, thanking Mr. Szajkowski again for moving everything along and always thinking on his feet. She knows the end result will be spectacular and the community and the students will be very happy!

On behalf of the Board of Education and the Central Office Administration, Ms. Ben-Levy welcomed the new Student Representative, Zach Mashaal, thanking him for taking time out of his busy school schedule to join us and to be civically responsible.

Ms. Ben-Levy then briefly mentioned Homecoming on October 4th, commenting on what a great day that always is for our community. She specifically thanked Drs. Brostowski and Lazarus for their roles in making it work so well.

Finally, with a mention to the date on the calendar, Ms. Ben-Levy asked for a moment of silence to remember everyone who lost their lives on September 11th. Afterward, Ms. Ben-Levy remembered specifically the community members we lost that day.

Superintendent's Comments

B.3. Recommendation to approve a credit change order as indicated below. This change order will decrease the contract with Relle Electric Corp. in the amount of \$11,177.69 and therefore decrease purchase order H25-00067 in account code H-1620-293-08-24HS.

Relle Electric Corp. (HS EC-001) represents a credit in the amount of \$11,177.69. This credit change order represents the provision and installation of (2) new pole-top fixtures for the existing light poles within the tennis court area at a total cost of \$2,463.35 and a contract credit in the amount of \$13,641.04 for changes in the original scope of work. This was first presented to the Board of Education as a Pending Change Order on 6/24/25 as item B.28.

B.4. Recommendation to approve a change order as indicated below. This change order will result in an increase in the contract with Relle Electric Corp. in the amount of \$26,104.46 after utilizing the \$20,000.00 Electrical Construction Allowance which will increase purchase order H25-00067 in account code H-1620-293-08-24HS.

Relle Electric Corp. (HS EC-002) represents all work necessary to reroute electrical service feeding the Administration Building which was encroaching on the baseball field worksite. This was first presented to the Board of Education as a Pending Change Order on 6/24/25 as item B.29.
