The academic curriculum at Nazareth Academy High School is thriving as we continue to foster intellectual skills and assist students with preparedness for college. Our Catholic high school academy is more than just an institution of learning – it is a vibrant community grounded in Gospel values, academic excellence, and a commitment to service. We are excited about the growth in our student population which has resulted in the establishment of additional faculty positions to ensure

the personal attention continues to be given to each student. The smaller class sizes at Nazareth Academy provide individualized instruction that allows the faculty to adapt their teaching methodologies to meet the needs of each student and promote a greater understanding of the material presented.

Through the rigorous curriculum offered at Nazareth Academy, students acquire integral skills including critical thinking, creativity, and problem solving. All classes are offered at either college prep, honors, or advanced placement levels which allows for the flexibility to meet each student's needs, and design curricula based upon their interests and specific college goals. In addition to our diverse and challenging curricula, we have partnerships with Arrupe Virtual Learning Institute and Holy Family University, which offer additional course selections for specialized student requests. Equally important, we cultivate an environment where faith is lived daily, encouraging students to grow in moral integrity, compassion, and social responsibility.


Beginning this Fall of 2025, we will be launching our new Pre-Health Majors Program which is intended for students who are focused on pursuing health careers. We will begin partnering current students with NAHS alumnae for externships. In addition, we will be commencing our rocketry program. In alignment with our strategic plan, we have developed an external course review partnership with Holy Family University, where departments, courses, and course sequences are evaluated by college professors for insights to ensure a culture of continuous improvement.



The Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth (CSFN) are joyfully commemorating a remarkable milestone this year – the 150th anniversary of their founding by Mother Mary Frances Siedliska, a noblewoman from Poland who established the congregation in Rome in 1875. The yearlong celebration began on December 1, 2024, and was highlighted by a private audience with Pope Francis, who praised their mission and encouraged them to serve as “thresholds” of hope for families.

Mother Mary Frances Siedliska’s desire to establish a convent in Philadelphia began in 1893 when she first viewed the land near the Torresdale train station while traveling to visit Mother Katherine Drexel. This vision came to life on December 6, 1920, when the congregation acquired the 23-acre Middleton Estate. A groundbreaking ceremony was held on April 24, 1927, for a building that would serve as a provincial home, novitiate, and high school. Nazareth Academy High School welcomed the first 10 students in the fall of 1928 and has continued to educate young women in a college preparatory program throughout the last 98 years.

Over the past 150 years, the Sisters have served in 14 countries across five continents, establishing more than 140 communities worldwide. The jubilee celebration reflects their commitment to emulate the values and virtues of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, as well as their 150 years of service to God’s people. Rooted in Nazareth spirituality – which emphasizes recognizing God’s presence in daily life – the Mission of the CSFN Sisters is shared and embraced by the entire Nazareth Academy High School community

The unwavering commitment of the CSFN Sisters to serving others is reflected through their many ministries, including education, healthcare, pastoral care, and support for the elderly and vulnerable. Through their dedication to education, the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth have empowered generations of young women at Nazareth Academy High School to grow academically, personally, and spiritually. Their example of a life devoted to serving God’s people continues to inspire Nazareth students to care for others and to seek God’s presence in the everyday moments of life.

LEADING WITH PURPOSE:

A Conversation with our new President, AmyLynn Flood '91



What attracted you to Nazareth Academy as a student?

My first introduction to Nazareth was when I came to take the entrance exam. What truly drew me in, however, was learning about the vibrant Music Department and the unique opportunity to be a “music major” in high school – something that felt incredibly unique. Like so many Nazareth students, I immersed myself in a wide range of activities, from Chorale, Glee Club, and Handbell Choir to Choir Connection, Community Service Corps, National Honor Society, and Tri-M Music Honor Society. Each of these experiences helped me discover new talents and shape the person I am today.

How did Nazareth Academy prepare you to attend La Salle University? In what way did the curriculum at NA influence your academic and career pursuits?

Nazareth provided an outstanding foundation for my college journey. I took several AP courses, which not only challenged me academically but also allowed me to start at La Salle with several credits already earned. That “head start” gave me the flexibility to pursue an internship during my junior year without delaying graduation – an experience that greatly influenced my career path. The rigor of my courses at Nazareth, combined with the support of my teachers, prepared me to thrive in college and beyond.

Did your experiences in 16 years of Catholic Education encourage you and your husband to send your children to Catholic school?

Absolutely. Catholic Education has been woven into my life since childhood. My mom was a Catholic school teacher for more than 20 years, and I had the privilege of being taught by the Handmaids of the Sacred Heart, the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth, and the Christian Brothers. Each of them instilled in me the importance of faith, service, and striving for excellence both academically and personally. My husband and I wanted our children to be formed in those same values, which is why we chose Catholic grade school and high school for both of them.

What would you like our community to know about your family?

My husband and I met during my sophomore year of college, and we’ve been together ever since – we’ll celebrate 28 years of marriage this September. We are blessed with two wonderful children: our daughter, Addy, who is a senior at the University of Arizona, and our son, Joey, who is a senior at Paul VI High School. 2026 will be an exciting year for our family with two graduations to celebrate!

Where do you see Nazareth Academy today and where would you like to see it in the future?

Nazareth remains steadfast in its Mission to prepare young women both academically and spiritually for success. Today, our students have countless opportunities to explore diverse subjects, engage in extracurricular activities, and serve as role models and mentors to one another. Looking ahead, I hope to see Nazareth continue to elevate its academic offerings, integrate our Mission even more deeply into decision-making, and make strategic investments that strengthen our ability to serve future generations. Faith, Family, and Education will always be the pillars of our school – and the guiding light for its future.

How do you view your role as a leader of young women? Do you believe it’s important for them to acquire leadership skills during their high school years?

I believe it is essential for young women to discover and cultivate their leadership potential during high school. Nazareth provides so many avenues for students to lead – whether through Kairos, Student Council, Athletics, or the Performing Arts. These opportunities build confidence and resilience, which empower our graduates to thrive in college and in their personal and professional lives. As a leader, my role is to encourage, guide, and open doors for them so they can see themselves as capable of making an impact in the world.

What should NA alumnae know about the future?

Alumnae should know that the future at Nazareth Academy is incredibly bright! Enrollment has steadily increased over the past three years, and we’re already seeing strong interest from 8th graders in the Class of 2030. Our graduates continue to achieve remarkable success – 100% of the Class of 2025, for example, has been accepted to four-year universities. Service remains central to student life, ensuring that every young woman leaves Nazareth not only academically prepared but also committed to making a difference in her community. We are also pursuing new partnerships and opportunities that will enrich our students’ experiences, and we look forward to sharing more soon. Most importantly, I invite all alumnae to come back, reconnect, and witness firsthand the exciting things happening on campus.



The Nazareth Academy High School community came together on May 30th to celebrate the accomplishments of the Class of 2025 at their Baccalaureate Mass and Commencement Ceremony. Gathered in the Immaculate Conception Chapel for Mass, the graduates reflected on their years at Nazareth Academy with gratitude and prayed for wisdom and courage as they embrace their next journey.

The graduation ceremony celebrated the academic accomplishments of the sixty-seven graduates as well as the meaningful milestone of completing their time at Nazareth. Together, the Class of 2025 was awarded an impressive \$30,363,512 in scholarships and institutional grants, and 99% of these graduates matriculated into four-year institutions. Guiding Students Towards Success

Meet the dedicated School Counselors who provide personalized support to help our students navigate academic challenges, plan for their future, and grow both personally and socially throughout their high school journey:

Alyssa Scheerbaum '12 has been guiding students as the Director of College Counseling for five years. She mentors students through their post-secondary journey, which begins in freshman year and continues throughout their time at Nazareth, while also moderating programs such as Morgan's Alliance and the Diocesan Scholars Program.

"The most meaningful part of my work is giving back to the Sisterhood and supporting our students just like the counselors supported me during my time as a student at Nazareth."

Sara Christopher came to Nazareth Academy in December 2024 as a College Counselor. She arranges college visits; recruits industry leaders to come to campus to speak to classes and works with students to ensure they receive the support they need through every step of the decision-making process.

"If I can help a student see that setbacks don't define them, and that their path is uniquely theirs, then it makes every tear wiped and every high-five given worth it."

Mary Jane Whiteley is in her fifth year as the Director of Counseling and oversees a department that provides counseling for students, parents, faculty, and administration. She coordinates Cora services along with meeting with students to address and promote academic, personal/emotional, social and career development as well as crisis related support.

"It is an absolute privilege and joy to be a part of our girls' development and to provide support and understanding as they navigate through their high school years."

Emma Menszak has been a guiding presence as a Counselor at Nazareth Academy throughout the last 18 years. She meets with students each semester to support all aspects of their student experience and provides extra guidance where needed.

"A meaningful day for me is when a student regains perspective or finds a new way to approach a challenge. Seeing them leaving feeling lighter, brighter and more hopeful brings me joy."

NAPA's Efforts Enrich the Nazareth Experience

The Nazareth Academy Parents' Association (NAPA) plays an essential part in supporting our school community by hosting a variety of fundraising events and initiatives throughout the year. Signature events like the Father/Daughter Mini Golf Tournament, Mother/Daughter Welcome Mass and Breakfast, the Fashion Show, raffles, and other special gatherings help raise funds that directly benefit our students, faculty, and programs. These efforts enrich the Nazareth experience by providing resources for educational opportunities, extracurricular activities, and campus improvements while fostering a strong sense of community and pride. During the 2024-25 school year, NAPA raised an impressive \$46,600, which supported key projects such as new interior doors at the main entrance and the installation of a Raptor School Safety visitor management system.

Seasons of Success for Panda Athletics

Nazareth Academy Athletics upheld its tradition of excellence during the 2024-25 seasons, capturing three Philadelphia Catholic League (PCL) championships and honoring 14 student-athletes who committed to continue their athletic careers at the collegiate level.

The Cross Country team built on last season's success, claiming their second consecutive PCL title and earning a runner-up finish in the PIAA District XII finals. Meanwhile, Adrianna Seravalli '27 led the Golf Team to a PCL Girls Division Championship with her impressive second-place individual finish, which also qualified her for the PIAA State Championships, where she placed ninth. PIAA All-State Goalkeeper, Gracie Sullivan '25, led the Soccer Team into the playoffs where they finished runner-up in the Catholic League Championship game. Gracie was also selected as the Northeast Times Girls Soccer Player of the Year and Philadelphia Catholic League Most Valuable Player.

Swimming showcased their dominance when 12 individual swimmers earned All-Catholic Honors and captured back-to-back titles in the Philadelphia Catholic League and PIAA District XII Championships. During the basketball season, Reese Power '25 became the sixth player in Nazareth Academy history to attain 1,000 points during her career. This accomplishment earned Reese second team All-Catholic honors, and she was selected as the Northeast Times Female Athlete of the Year.

Spring saw the introduction of Flag Football as a varsity sport at Nazareth Academy. Under the direction of coaches (and faculty members) Tim Clark and John Marchese, players learned fundamentals of the game and continuously improved as the season progressed. Softball claimed the PIAA District XII title behind pitcher, Jillian DiMario '25 and advanced to the quarterfinal round of the state playoffs. Jillian earned third team All-Catholic Honors and was selected as the Northeast Times Softball Player of the Year. The season for the Outdoor Track & Field Team culminated with a 2nd place finish at the Catholic League Championships where 10 athletes qualified to compete in the PIAA state championships.




