### SCHOOL OVERVIEW

Laguna Blanca School is a coeducational, college preparatory day school serving students in grades Early Kindergarten to Grade 12. The school opened its doors in 1933 to 45 young men and graduated its first official class four years later in 1937. Laguna Blanca became coeducational in 1942. Today, the school enjoys two campuses: the original 35-acre facility that features our Middle and Upper School programs for Grades 5-12 in the beautiful residential neighborhood of Hope Ranch and our charming EK-4 Lower School campus located in Montecito. The city of Santa Barbara is a suburban coastal community 100 miles north of Los Angeles that hosts a population of 90,000 and a metropolitan population of 440,000.

## ACADEMICS, ATHLETICS, AND THE ARTS

Laguna Blanca students **must complete no fewer than six and no more than seven classes each semester and the equivalent of 24 yearlong courses** during their high school tenure. Transcripts record semester grades for all courses, which meet five days a week on an eight-day rotating cycle. Alongside core academics, students pursue visual and performing arts that foster creativity and expression, with opportunities to present their work in exhibitions, concerts, and productions. Co- and extracurricular offerings provide further breadth and balance. Laguna Blanca's athletic program fields teams at the junior varsity and varsity level in 15 sports and competes in California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) competition.

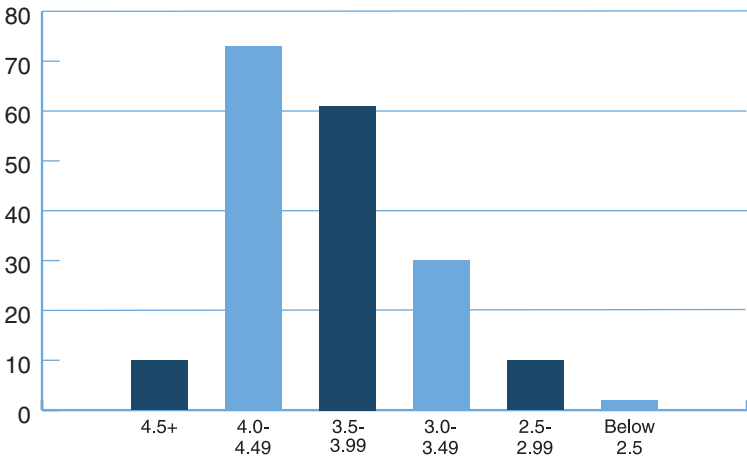

## GRADING CRITERIA AND GRADE DISTRIBUTION

**Laguna Blanca Does Not Rank Its Students.**

Laguna Blanca School computes unweighted and weighted grade-point averages (GPA) for each student. Advanced Placement courses receive an additional 1.0 grade point, and Honors classes receive an additional 0.5 grade point each semester. **Due to the rigor of Laguna's overall curriculum, students are advised to take no more than three AP courses per year in 11th and 12th grade. Students may not take AP courses in 9th and 10th grade, with the exception of advanced placement in a math or world language course. All Laguna students enrolled in an AP course are required to take the College Board AP exam.**

## UPPER SCHOOL SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

### Humanities Research Program

This two-year program integrates literature, history, and the arts through lectures, field experiences, and multimedia. Students engage with researchers and in experiential learning opportunities. Juniors publish and present capstone projects synthesizing their interdisciplinary research.

### Science Research Program

This selective program immerses students in advanced scientific inquiry through coursework, seminars, and mentorships. Each junior conducts original research and publishes and presents their findings in a professional scholarly defense.

### Journalism: *The Fourth Estate*

Students develop skills in research, reporting, writing, and design while producing Laguna Blanca's award-winning publication. Advanced students assume editorial leadership and represent the school at journalism forums.

### TEDxLagunaBlancaSchool

This program develops leadership and organizational skills through planning TEDxLagunaBlancaSchool. Students oversee theme selection, speakers, stage design, marketing, and sponsorships, producing a professional event for the Santa Barbara community.

### Senior Projects

Senior projects have been a meaningful tradition and graduation requirement at Laguna for over 30 years. Each senior completes 60

hours of internship work at an enterprise of their choice, culminating with formal presentations and reflection papers on their experience.

### Honors Play Production

This program engages Laguna's most advanced thespians in rehearsing and staging a major production. Students participate in performance and technical roles, culminating in a professional public performance.

### Honors Stage Band

This ensemble challenges musicians to refine artistry, expand repertoire, and demonstrate leadership. Students perform on and off campus, often collaborating with other ensembles and the school community.

### Advanced Vocal Ensemble

Reserved for advanced vocalists, this course emphasizes technical mastery, sight-reading, and sophisticated repertoire. Students perform in multiple formal settings within the school and at external concerts.

### Advanced Portfolio

This signature program empowers advanced artists to work independently, developing a concept-driven portfolio that showcases technical mastery, creative depth, and a cohesive body of original work.

### Yearbook: *La Honda*

The *La Honda* staff documents the EK-12 school year with joy, inclusivity, and design excellence. Students gain professional skills in journalism, photography, and publishing while preserving school history.
