3. SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS: American’s Healthiest Schools – Kathy Atwood

School Health Coordinator, Kathy Atwood, informed the Board that all three of Trousdale County Schools have been included in the list of America’s Healthiest Schools by the Alliance for a Healthier Generation. She noted that only (11) schools in Tennessee achieved this notable distinction.

4. PRINCIPALS' REPORTS:

4.A. Trousdale County Elementary School – Ms. Badru stated that student attendance has been exceptional and that the school is off to a very good start. She noted that the school is adjusting to the new :40 minutes of daily recess which has been well received by students. She said that the TN ALL Corps tutoring for 4th and 5th graders has begun and is presently going well. She also stated that the school has completed its Q1 Universal Reading Screenings for which reports would soon be disseminated to parents. Ms. Badru concluded by stating that the school is already beginning to plan for the upcoming Parent-Teacher Conferences to be held on October 16 and that the Fire Department will soon be providing fire safety trainings for students.

4.B. Jim Satterfield Middle School – Mr. Gulley stated that the middle school’s enrollment was slightly up from last year to (336) students while student attendance has been exceptional. He stated that the Q1 writing benchmark is taking place this week and that the online assessment would be the following week. He noted that the school uses the same testing groups and protocols as the spring TCAP assessment in order to help students reduce test anxiety. Mr. Gulley stated that the Move2Stand bullying prevention program was well received and that he included 6th graders for the first time this year. He stated that there were

not any findings from the most recent canine search and the benefit of how the routine canine searches fit into the school's safety planning. Mr. Gulley stated that the middle school football and volleyball seasons have concluded for the year with the football team losing to Westmoreland in the play-off game.

4.C. Trousdale County High School – Mr. McCall stated that it has been a good start to the school year. He stated that the school is presently administering Q1 benchmark assessments and added that the Move2Stand program has been a good program in supporting a positive school climate and culture. Mr. McCall informed the Board that the annual band competition would be held on Saturday in which eight bands will be performing. Mr. McCall concluded by highlighting that the Tennessee State University band would be performing at the football game vs. Smith County tomorrow. He stated that the TSU band will play the National Anthem and perform at halftime.

4.D. Student School Board Representative - Student representative, Zoey Vaughn, updated the board about student life and activities highlighted by the football team's recent win over Innovation Academy. She announced that homecoming will be held on Friday, October 3 vs. Jackson County. Zoey said that the homecoming pep rally would be held outside at the football stadium. She reported that the FBLA club toured the University of Tennessee's "Big Orange" Day on September 11. She stated that club membership is presently up to (67) students. Zoey concluded by informing the Board that the FFA club led by President Anna Towns will be reading to second grade students in October as part of the PLOW (Passing Literacy ForWard) program.

5. DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

5.A. Employment Notifications

5.B. Academic and Goal Updates – Dr. Satterfield informed the Board that present student enrollment is down (19) students from the same time last year. He stated that Q1 benchmark assessments are scheduled to begin on September 29 and that the Senior ACT retake opportunity will be held on October 8, noting that the opportunity is free to all seniors. He stated that planning for the upcoming October 16 Parent-Teacher Conference is already underway. Dr. Satterfield highlighted that the State Board of Education will be visiting the high school as part of their "Day in the District" on November 4. He also noted that the school district had recently been recognized in two national publications, Education Week and Policy Innovators in Education, for the district's education practices that have led to outstanding learning outcomes for students.

5.C. Project Updates – Dr. Satterfield informed the Board that the replacement chiller for the middle school had been ordered with an anticipated delivery date of mid-January. He stated that the installation bid opening will be held on Friday. He updated the Board on the progress of the new athletic complex noting that the east and west side steps had been reworked. He stated that the window and door frames are presently being installed and that the contractors are onsite and beginning to install the HVAC and electrical. Dr. Satterfield said that he understands that the metal roof will be installed within the next two weeks.
