COMBINED AGENDA STUDY SESSION
AND REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING

SEPTEMBER 8, 2025

CALL TO ORDER

The combined agenda study session and regular business meeting of the Board of Directors of the Fox Chapel Area School District was called to order by president, Marybeth Dadd, at 7 p.m. on September 8, 2025, in the LGI Room at Fox Chapel Area High School. Prior to tonight's public meeting, members of the Board met in executive session to review and discuss matters related to school safety, that if conducted in public would be reasonably likely to impair the effectiveness of the safety or security measure or jeopardize the safety and security of a resource, infrastructure, or information storage system. The Board also discussed information and strategy related to contractual or labor relations matters.

ROLL-CALL

GUESTS

•Fox Chapel Area High School senior **Ulyana Kubini** was named a winner of the prestigious Coolidge Scholarship. The full-ride presidential scholarship, which covers four years of tuition, room, board, and expenses, can be used to pursue undergraduate studies at any accredited college or university program in the United States. Nearly 5,000 students applied and Ulyana was one of only five from throughout the country to be named a Coolidge Scholar in the 2024-2025 school year.

Coolidge Scholars embody the principles and legacy of Calvin Coolidge by maintaining exemplary academic performance, exhibiting an interest in public policy and an appreciation of the values President Coolidge championed, and demonstrating humility and performing service to others.

At Fox Chapel Area High School, Ulyana is the president of the Technology Student Association (TSA) where she competes in data science and analytics, and in an event called "debating technology issues." She has also participated in the high school's speech and debate club where she served as the director of speech, and she is also co-president of the science fair club.

Outside of school, Ulyana conducts research in ophthalmic microbiology at the UPMC Vision Institute under Dr. Robert Shanks. She has also written articles for numerous economic think tanks on public health and runs an e-commerce company that has onboarded vendors from across the country and abroad. Community service is also important to Ulyana and she is involved with an organization called the Mtindo Network Development Initiative, which is a free market think tank based out of Uganda. The Mtindo Network was founded by Students for Liberty members in Africa and Ulyana serves as Mtindo's director of international relations. Mtindo has distributed more than 10,000 books across seven countries, partnering with over a dozen leading professors in the United States and the European Union. Ulyana has also volunteered at the Penn Hills Library.

Ulyana wants to study public health, neuroscience, or human biology and plans on becoming a doctor.

Coolidge Scholars are ambassadors for the Coolidge Fund and the Coolidge Foundation. Students apply for the scholarship during their junior year. Up to 10 finalists are flown in for a finalist weekend at the Coolidge Historic Site in Plymouth Notch, Vermont, where they interview with the Coolidge Scholars finalist jury. The summer before their senior year, newly-selected Coolidge Scholars spend several orientation days in Plymouth Notch, the birthplace of President Coolidge. While there, they study about

President Coolidge and oversee the Coolidge Foundation’s formidable debate programs. While in college, the scholars also return to Plymouth Notch for a week each summer.

•Fox Chapel Area High School junior **Victoria Pfendler** was honored by the United Nations Association of the USA (UNA-USA) and InnerView Technologies as part of the 2024-2025 National Community Service Awards. The program is open to students across the nation and is designed to connect student community service activities, skill development, and commitment to Sustainable Development Goals to transform our world. Victoria was also the recipient of the Kroger Co. Zero Hero Zero Hunger Award which is given to students for taking action to help create communities free of hunger.

For her largest volunteer effort, Victoria has spent the last three years helping at the Christ the King Giving Garden. There, she is involved in a variety of tasks with regard to growing healthy fruits and vegetables that benefit the St. Vincent de Paul and Blawnox food pantries. In total, she has spent more than 102 hours volunteering.

According to Victoria, “Volunteering at the garden has taught me the value of hard work and community service, and I’m proud to be part of an effort that helps provide fresh, healthy food to people in my community.”

The Giving Garden’s mission is to serve the community by practicing sustainable gardening and donating fresh produce to local food pantries, helping to address food insecurity and promote environmental responsibility.

Melissa DeStout, the coordinator of the community garden, says she is grateful for the time and creativity Victoria has dedicated.

“Victoria has been an integral part of our volunteer team, contributing her time, effort, and skills to support our mission of serving the community through sustainable gardening practices and food donation initiatives,” she says.

Victoria has also participated in many activities at Fox Chapel Area High School, including the girls tennis team, Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA), the pickleball club, and community outreach. She is also serving as a student ambassador during the 2025-2026 school year.


