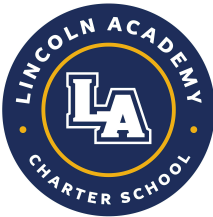
Boys Basketball

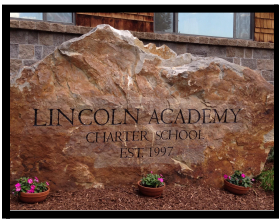
