Pathways to Graduation



To earn a high school diploma, students must complete at least one of the following pathway requirements that are aligned to their *High School and Beyond Plan* in addition to required course credits.

1 Demonstrate College & Career Readiness in ELA and MATH

Smarter Balanced (SBA) test in ELA and MATH

The first pathway is to meet graduation cut scores on state tests. All students take the tests in 10th grade with retakes available in 11th and 12th grades. (ELA \geq 2548, Math \geq 2595).

NOTE: An IEP team may designate the use of WA-AIM instead of SBA.

- SAT w/Essay (\geq 410)
- AP Exam (\geq 3) or course grade (\geq C+)

2 Demonstrate Career Readiness with CTE Course Sequence

Students can meet a pathway requirement by earning a minimum of 2.0 credits in a designated CTE pathway that is aligned to their *High School and Beyond Plan*. CTE Pathways can be earned at all high schools and Pierce County Skills Center. Specific course pathways can be found at bethelsd.org/coursecatalog.

3 Demonstrate Armed Services Readiness with ASVAB test scores

Students whose *High School and Beyond Plan* includes enlisting in the military can meet pathway requirements with an ASVAB score of 31 or higher. *NOTE: different branches may require different cut scores.*

4 Additional alternatives available for a limited time

- Most common appeal is admission to a post-secondary institution



Senior Advisory Requirements



- Passing Advisory is a graduation requirement! It fulfills the High School and Beyond Plan requirement set by the State.
- Seniors are responsible for 8 hours of Community Connections. These hours can be job shadow and/or community service. These hours must be completed in the senior year.
- All seniors* must complete the Culminating Project which is presented at their Student Led Conference (SLC) in the spring. This includes a 2-5 page paper reflecting on their high school experience and how it has impacted their post-high school plans. You cannot pass Advisory without these.
- A full assignment description and SLC scoring rubric will be shared via Advisory.
- **Running Start students completed these requirements through their College Success class. They do not need to do a SLC or reflection paper.*



Junior Advisory Requirements



- Juniors are responsible for 8 hours of Community Connections. At least 4 of these hours should be job shadow and the balance are community service hours. They must be completed in the junior year.
- As seniors you will complete a culminating project which will incorporate your experiences from junior year.
- **Running Start students completed these requirements through their College Success class. They do not need to do a SLC or reflection paper*

NCAA core academic requirements



Your GPA is calculated based on the grades you earn in NCAA-approved core courses. Only your best grades from the required number of NCAA core courses will be used. For example, if you took 18 classes that counted toward your 16 core classes, we will count the 16 with the highest grades to meet the core-course distribution requirement. This ensures you are getting the highest GPA possible. This [core-course](#) worksheet may help.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS
To study and compete at a Division I or II school, you must earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits, earn a corresponding test score* that matches your core-course GPA and submit your final transcript with proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

GRADE-POINT AVERAGE

While Division III schools set their own admissions and academic requirements, international student-athletes (first-year enrollees and transfers) who initially enroll full time at a Division III school on or after Aug. 1, 2023, are required to complete an [Amateurism-Only Certification account](#). 5 REASONS YOU SHOULD FILL OUT THE FAFSA

IT'S FAST.

It takes most students just 23 minutes to complete the FAFSA: less time than it would take to watch your favorite show.

YOU PROBABLY QUALIFY.

More people qualify for federal student aid than you think — chances are, you're leaving money on the table by not applying.

5

IT MAY BE REQUIRED.

Many states, schools, and private scholarships require you to submit the FAFSA before they'll consider you for any financial aid.


