Our Community

Roseville Independent School District 623 is a suburban residential community located within the metropolitan area north of the Twin Cities in Ramsey County and has a population of over 57,400. The district is comprised of the Cities of Roseville, Shoreview, Maplewood, Little Canada, Falcon Heights, Lauderdale, and Arden Hills. The district offers comprehensive educational programs for students in kindergarten through twelfth grade. Enrollment for the school district is estimated at approximately 7,500 students. Our student population is diverse, with over 40 different languages spoken by students, families and faculty.

Curriculum

Roseville Area High School offers a comprehensive curriculum of approximately 200 courses, providing preparation and six-year planning for college-bound students, post secondary vocational students and students planning to enter the workforce following graduation. The school offers a wide variety of courses to build a strong education foundation in language arts, mathematics, social studies, science, business education, career technology education, fine arts, health, and physical education. Roseville Area High School offers students a wide variety of extra-curricular activities. Students can participate in numerous MSHSL sponsored activities and athletics, fine arts and performing arts groups, and a great mixture of student clubs from cultural clubs to eGames. Honors and Awards

Since 1986, Roseville has had 20 Minnesota State High School League State team athletic championships, including adapted sports.

In the last five years RAHS earned 9 conference championships and 5 section titles.

RAHS music groups perform over 20 concerts per year, and have also performed in Chicago, Madison, Denver, Albuquerque, New Orleans, Memphis, Nashville, Washington D.C., Toronto, Winnipeg, St. Louis, Lexington, San Francisco, Seattle, and New York. At least 35 RAHS students qualify and attend the All Conference Band, Choir, and Orchestra each year, and from 5 to as many as 20 students to All State music ensembles each year.

AVID National Demonstration Site

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is a global non-profit organization that works with schools and districts to provide direct support for students in grades K-16. The mission of AVID is to close the opportunity gap by preparing ALL students for college and career readiness and success in a global society. In Roseville Area Schools, AVID supports students in grades 7-12 with a school-wide curriculum and rigorous expectations. Over 250 students are enrolled in AVID elective classes. Held during the regular school day, the elective class is the foundation of AVID. The curriculum focuses on writing, college and careers, strategies for success, and critical reading.

Roseville Area High School is an AVID National Demonstration Site. AVID National Demonstration Schools are centers of teaching and learning that also serve as models for those interested in learning about the AVID College Readiness System.

Grading System

Roseville High School uses a 4.0 grading scale.

P indicates that credit is earned for the course and Proficient. NM indicates that credit was not earned for the course.

AU indicates that a student audited the class for no credit.

Neither a P or NM affect student GPAs. Students also had an option to receive letter grades for the trimester.

It is the practice of Roseville Area High School not to report a student's disciplinary record to colleges and universities.

Transcripts

Roseville Area High School uses Xello to request and send transcripts to schools throughout the United States. All current students have Xello accounts established already.
