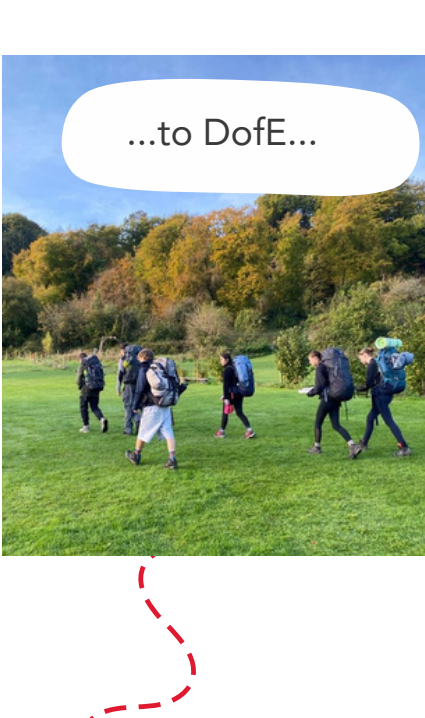
In the meantime, I wish all our students a year filled with learning, curiosity, and connection - a year to **think, dare, share and care!**

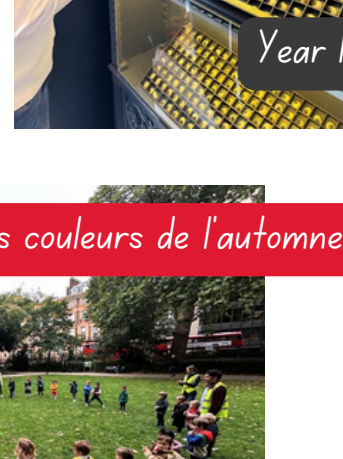

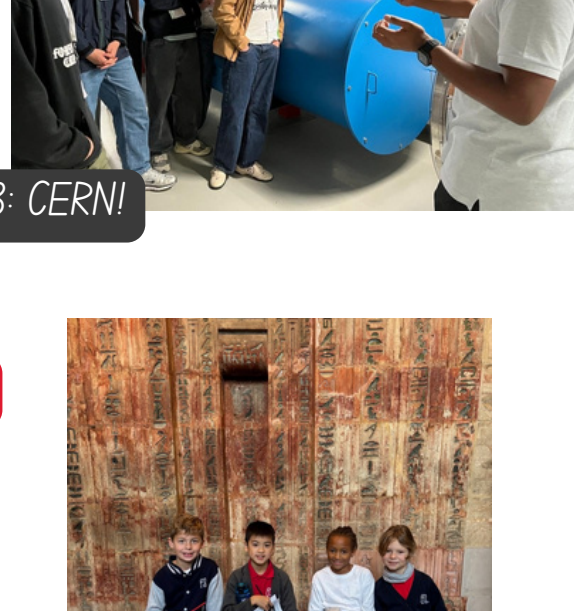

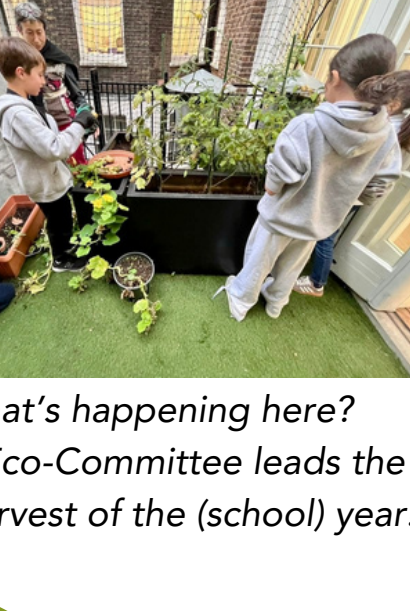

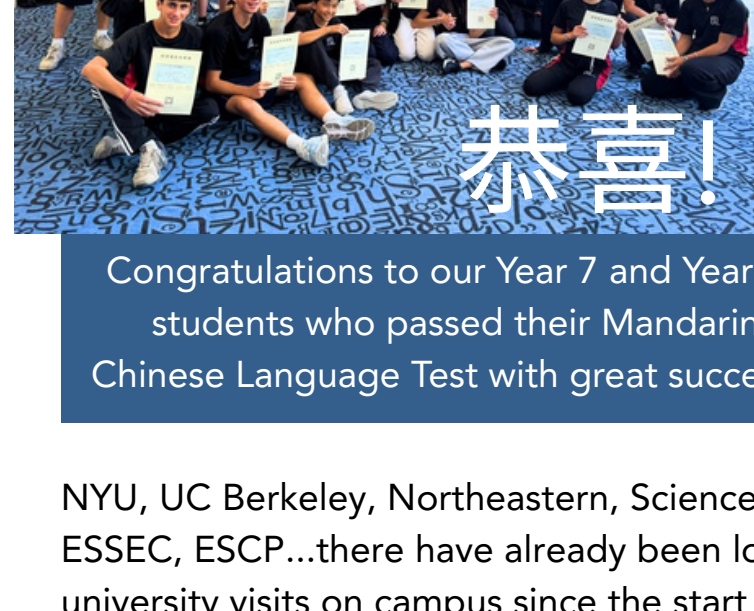

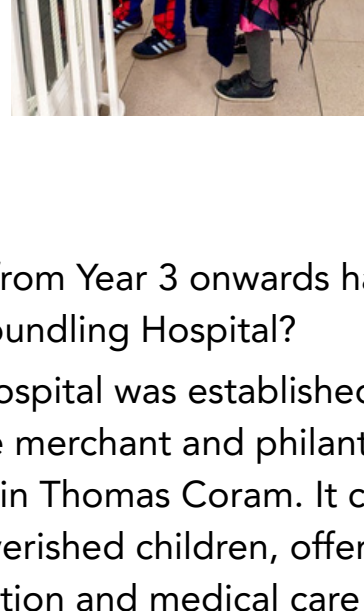

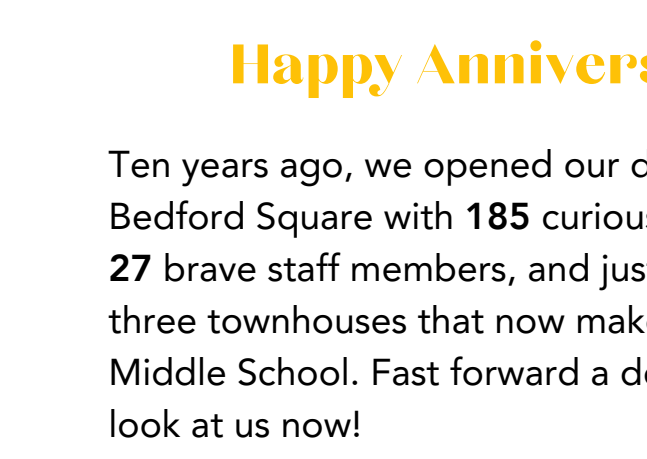


Did you know...

...that Coram's Fields - where our students from Year 3 onwards have their PE lessons - sits on the former site of the Foundling Hospital?

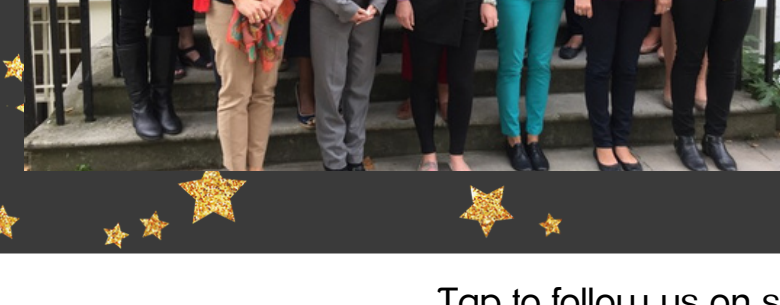


Sports' Day, Race Against Hunger...many sporting events take place at Coram's Fields!



The hospital was established in 1739 by the merchant and philanthropist Captain Thomas Coram. It cared for impoverished children, offering education and medical care at a time of rampant disease.

In the 1920s the hospital moved to the countryside, and a new building was created to house the Foundling Museum, which preserves the art donated to the hospital over time. Seven acres of the original Bloomsbury site were bought by Lord Rothermere for use as a playground, becoming the Coram's Fields we know today!
