### SPARKING THE LOVE OF LEARNING

Kindergarten early reading assessment data shows that ISD 191 VPK students consistently perform as well as, and often better than, their peers who did not attend VPK.

#### Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten 4 years by 9/1/25

Our Voluntary Pre-K (VPK) program helps your child build a love for learning in a caring, inclusive environment. VPK classrooms spark curiosity, promote early literacy, and support social-emotional growth, setting the foundation for a successful kindergarten experience. Morning and afternoon sessions are available. Transportation and meal services are provided at neighboring schools. Diamondhead also offers full-day VPK from 9 am-3:30 pm with wraparound care options and parent transportation. Independent toileting skills required (no pull-ups). Fees are based on eligibility and a sliding fee scale.

#### Preschool 3 years by 9/1/25

One91 Preschool offers a nurturing, play-based program designed to spark curiosity and build school readiness for children ages three to five. With caring teachers, hands-on learning, and a focus on social-emotional development, our preschools help young learners thrive academically, emotionally, and socially. Parent transportation. Independent toileting skills required (no pull-ups). Fee-based, scholarships available. Five days per week, mornings or afternoons at Diamondhead Education Center.

#### Preschool Plus 3 years by 12/1/25


