Prior to the start of the 2025-26 school year, Holtville Unified School District provided professional development for teachers in English Language Development (ELD) and AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination). AVID is a program that helps students develop the skills and habits needed to succeed in school and prepare for college and careers.

During the training, teachers learned strategies to support multilingual learners, improve student engagement and build critical thinking and organizational skills. Through workshops and coaching, educators gained practical tools to create effective, inclusive classrooms that help all students succeed during the 2025-26 school year.







Free Mobile Dentist

According to the California School-Based Health Alliance, more than 60% of children aged 6 to 19 in California are affected by tooth decay. When left untreated, it can cause pain, difficulty eating, and trouble speaking — all of which can hinder a child's intellectual and social development. These issues contribute to significant school absenteeism, with an estimated 869,202 missed school days annually, costing school districts approximately \$60 million each year.



Read more about dental health here Big Smile Dental's Mobile Department is partnering with the HUSD Nurse's Office to provide free dental services directly to eligible TK—8th grade students. This collaboration removes barriers to oral healthcare by offering convenient, on-site services, including cleanings, exams and preventive treatments. A total of 71 students benefited from dental services last year. By providing care at school, the program supports student health

and promotes overall wellbeing. The dentist is scheduled to return Nov. 12–14, 2025. Please contact the school for more information.
