Parent, Student and Teacher Satisfaction with the School *5

Satisfaction Data:

The 2024 family survey had 124 respondents, an increase from 58 in 2023. On the major points, satisfaction with Christian Culture, with teaching, Learning Enrichment, administration, IT services and co-curricular, grew again, landing from 83% to 92%. Previous surveys contained several possible activities and several of these were activated in 2024. Parents indicated they were looking for more camps in Secondary and being a distance education school, more social activities. Plans to lift in these areas are included for 2026. Our significant growth in numbers and offerings suggest we are doing well. Ours is a unique school with 65% of our students with needs within the Learning Enrichment department which now has 30 teachers and aides. The quality of online teaching, paper and online resources and the ability to watch recorded lessons along with a responsive caring staff allows for a high-quality education that in many ways surpasses day school experiences.
