School Responsibilities

River Oaks Academy's Title I Policy encourages all parents to take an active role and be involved in their child's education. - Open House will be held on Thursday, August 20th from 5:00-7:00pm. Come out to learn all new and exciting things happening this year.
- Title I Parent Meeting will be held on Thursday, September 30th from 5:30-7:30 pm.
- 3 Parent Events will be held to provide parents with things to do with your child at home to support learning.

In addition:

- Teachers will provide monthly newsletters that will include suggestions on how to work with your child at home, lists of good books to read with your child, and important information.
- Work collaboratively with parents and school leaders and follow the rules and expectations for the school.
- Parent Events will be provided 3 additional times during the year to support parents in supporting learning at home.
- Results from parent surveys as well as teacher input will be considered when planning.

Parent Responsibilities

Each parent will:

- Make sure their child attends school every day and is on time and remains in school the entire school day from 8:30-3:30. Every minute counts.
- Be sure their child adheres to the current uniform policy.
- Work collaboratively with the school
- Follow rules and expectations of the school.
- Make sure your child reads nightly and completes any homework assigned
- Attend parent-teacher conferences and at least 1 learning session throughout the year. Conference to be held between October 28-November 8. Additional conferences will occur at the end of January and March.
- Attend at least 1 parent engagement event:

- Contact the teacher/staff when I have questions or concerns about your child.

- Monitor my child's TV and video game time and make sure my child is well rested
- Register and volunteer in my child's class/school when possible
- Check Thursday folders weekly
- Use and connect with the teacher in Parent Square.
- Have access to the Parent and Family Engagement Policy via the school webpage.
- The Annual Title I Review Meeting will be held at the end May of 2026. Parents are encouraged to share their feedback through a survey distributed throughout the year to collect suggestions, recommendations and concerns to improve the Title I program. In addition, parents are encouraged to attend the review meeting.
