(Growth from Baseline year 21-22 to 25-26).</b>	<b>Increase the percentage of students scoring at or above grade level in reading and mathematics by 5%, as measured by grade-level assessments.</b>
<b>Increase the district's School Climate rating score by 1.5% from the last time that a rating was provided (prepandemic).</b>	<b>Increase overall student attendance by 2% while reducing the number of tardies, early checkouts, and unexcused absences by 5%.</b>
<b>Retain current teachers and support the teachers to become more effective as documented in student achievement data and school climate data.</b>	<b>Reduce Office Referrals (ORs) and Minor Incident Reports (MIRs) by 5% through the consistent implementation of school-wide behavior expectations, increased use of positive behavior reinforcement strategies, and the integration of structured social-emotional learning (SEL) into daily instruction.</b>
