- **Welcome and Staff Introductions**

Welcome provided by the principal and face coordinator. Parents introduced themselves.

- **Title I Overview**

Intent and Purpose of Title I

Being a Title 1 school means receiving federal funding (Title 1 dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for providing timely assistance for student's experiencing academic difficulties to help these students meet the State's challenging content standards. Purchasing supplemental staff, programs, materials or supplies that support the schoolwide plan. Conducting parent and family engagement meetings, trainings or activities that will help parents support their children academically.

Title I Budget

Amount of funds available for this year is \$94,133. These are the Allocated funds: Librarian- \$70, 559, General Supplies- \$7,382, Books and Periodicals- \$10,000 and Parent & Family Engagement- \$6,192 Funds used for parent workshops.

Review of School Improvement Goals

Reviewed SIP goals, strategies, data and monitoring for student success. Parents encouraged to participate in SIP revision and provide feedback during designated times to draw more parents to participate in this process.

- **Inform of Curriculum and State Standards**

Reviewed the curriculums programs being utilized- K-5 ELA (Open Court), 6-8 ELA My Perspectives, K-8 Math- Illustrative Math. Ensuring the standards in reading and math at each grade level are being met and the goal if for all students to reach the proficient level on the PSSA.

- **Assessments (including progress monitoring)**
K-5 Dibels- Three benchmark assessments given in grades K-5 in the fall, winter and spring. CDT- Fall, Winter and Spring online assessment in reading, math and science grades 3-8. Lesson assessments given weekly and unit assessments given after the completion of the unit. State test results, report cards and progress reports are mailed and/or sent home. Parents can further monitor student progress by attending parent teacher conferences, log into the Home Access Center to monitor completion of student assignments and grades and schedule regular check ins with your child's teacher to discuss their progress.
- **Parent and Family Engagement**
Parent Trainings are offered throughout the year to support parents on how they can help support their child at home. The next parent workshop is on November 6th 5-6:30 which is a math/reading curriculum overview along with a parent make and take to support students at home. PSCC meeting dates and PAC meeting dates shared to encourage parent attendance and involvement.
