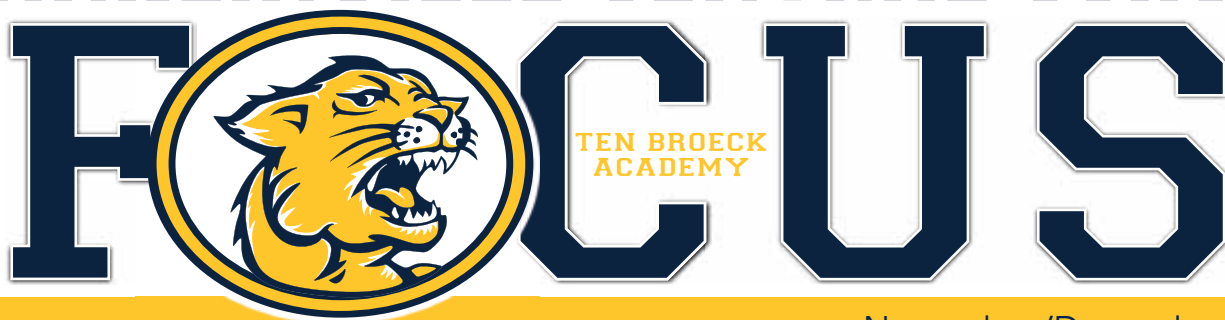

Attention Seniors: Please bring your college acceptance letters, college scholarships and awards to the Counseling Center. If you need help applying to college and/or for financial aid, or if you are interested in applying for a job and/or enlisting in the Military and need help with the next steps, please let me know. We will be working on scholarships in History and English class throughout the year. All seniors are eligible to apply for our Graduation Awards. More information is forthcoming.

Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors had a great time attending the College Consortium on September 19th and were able to speak with representatives from several colleges in and around WNY. Juniors and Seniors also toured Alfred State College on October 16th. We will continue to host and attend college visits throughout the year.

F/E TITANS CROSS COUNTRY

The Titans XC teams are doing a phenomenal job this year and are off to a great start. Returning athletes on the boys' team are senior Grant Cornell, junior Ben Wedvik (ECS), junior James McAuley, junior Johnson Li, sophomore Ethan Learn, sophomore Collin Weber (ECS), freshman Kellen Hatch. Joining our team at the varsity level is junior Derek Ossont. Our girls' varsity team are all returning athletes: senior Kaylee Fox, senior Trinity Herman, senior Peyton Mest, sophomore Eva Green and freshman Genevieve Herman.

We began our season with our annual trail run at Allegany State Park followed by our first meet, the Red Dragon Invitational at Bemus Point Golf Course at which the boys' team took third place. The student athletes have made great gains so far; running farther in practices to lower their times for competition. They have already experienced the reward for their hard work and effort. At our non-league meet both boys' and girls' teams took first place!

On Saturday, September 27, the F/E Titans cross country team competed in the 60th annual McQuaid Invitational in Rochester, NY. The race included over 7,000 athletes from over 260 schools in New York State and across the country. Some schools traveled from California, Colorado, and Ohio as well as Ontario, Canada to compete in this amazing competition. This meet is one of our favorites and a great experience for the teams. Just as always, they performed very well at the McQuaid Invitational- great job, athletes!

As our season is fast approaching its completion, we have some very exciting league meets and invitationals still to come. On Saturday, October 11th we will compete in the 39th annual Bulldog Cross Country Stampede at Alden CSD; Tuesday, October 14th at Randolph Golf Course; and Friday, October 17th at Sunset Stampede at Evangola State Park. The season will wrap up with the CCAA Championships at Bemus Point Golf Course on Friday, October 24th followed by sectionals at Elma Meadows Golf Course on Friday, October 31st. It has been a very exciting and successful season so far and we are anticipating even more success as we finish our season.

Lainey Dunlap, Grace Cornell, and Alayna Spittler have helped steady the mid-field with Molly. Alexea Hernandez has grown steadily to help both mid-field and forward. Our back four has been much stronger overall than last year with Addi Chamberlain and Selena Hernandez anchoring center-back and Carlie Aultman taking a big leap in her play on the outside. Addi Killingbeck, Faith Peterson, and Addy Buchanon have rotated nicely outside opposite Carlie. Kierra Knobloch has been a rock in goal-playing far more than our pre-season plan of splitting the keeper duties between her and the injured Taylor Chase. Kalina has gotten much needed experience in goal at times as well. Alyssa Lane has been another player we had high hopes for this year who has had to join Taylor on the sidelines this fall. Leading the charge is 10th grader Kayci Landow, who qualified for the Class C Championships in five events: the 100 Free, 100 Back, 500 Free, 200 IM, and 50 Free. Kayci has dropped time in every event and continues to shine as team captain, setting a powerful example of leadership and dedication.

9th grader Diana Li, our second captain, has also earned her spot at Class C Championships in the 200 IM, 200 Free, and 100 Breaststroke. Her steady improvement and mentorship have been instrumental in guiding our younger swimmers, especially the 7th and 8th graders.

Among those rising stars is 7th grader Elena Freedman, who

qualified in the 100 Butterfly and plays a key role in our relay teams. Her energy and enthusiasm are contagious—just don't forget the goggles, Elena!

8th grader Mia DuClon has earned the title of "Most Improved" this season, cutting over 35 seconds in her 500 Free and more than 6 seconds in her sprint events. Her contributions to the relay teams have been vital to our success.
